If you need to contact the County Manager, Clerk to the Board of Commissioners, Human Resources, or Finance Department, the aforementioned address/phone numbers will get you there.

Departments that have NOT moved include Planning (Permits, Inspections, GIS/Mapping, & Zoning), Tax, and Water. They are still located in the beige building behind and to the left of the courthouse, and look forward to serving your needs.

Camden County Planning Department

Camden Planning Projects Move Ahead

The Camden County Comprehensive Planning Process is nearing the half way mark, with anticipated completion by the end of June. The Steering Committee, consultants. and staff have been developing a "Land Suitability Map" and updating the "Existing Land Use Map". The next step is to develop two (2) growth scenarios - "Status Quo" which assumes development will occur in similar patterns (although not as fast) as past development; "Targeted Development" and which explores the impacts of growth in limited areas of the county. By the time this newsletter is distributed the Steering Committee will have met to review the assumptions for each scenario, and resulting maps, and some of the transportation and other infrastructure impacts. Keep a look out for upcoming public workshops that we will be holding in the April/May timeframe.

The Comprehensive Transportation Plan is also on track. The NC DOT staff has projected traffic volumes for future years, and is exploring very long range (30 year) alternatives for developing a US 158 Strategic Highway Corridor as required for the State's Long Range Transportation Plan.

Remember to visit this site regularly as it is continually updated with the most recent reports, maps, and public input opportunities.

Another planning project was recently completed. A group of senior and graduate students from the East Carolina University planning program completed a "Small Area Plan for South Mills Core Village". The report is based on planning research, two (2) field visits to South Mills, and community input from the residents of the village. While the plan is very conceptual as to use of specific parcels, many of the ideas are excellent and will be incorporated into the Comprehensive Plan. This report is also available on the county's web page under a link "South Mills Small Area Plan", as well as on the Planning Department page, and the Economic Development page.

Stormwater Advisory Committee

The first Camden County Stormwater Advisory Committee meeting was held on January 26, 2012. The meeting was held in the historic courthouse with all 8 members present as well as 3 of the Soil and Water Board Members, 3 County Commissioners, the Countv Manager, 3 Planning Department staff and 4 Camden citizens. There were a broad range of concerns that were established during the introductory and opening exercise. Problems such as beavers, lack of easements on drainage ditches and even some praise for good drainage maintenance in the Hale's Lake region of Camden. A second meeting was held on February 9, 2012 at Sawyers Creek Fire Station, where more problem areas were established and the committee recommended that we have an engineer come speak about rainfall calculations and the on-site storage of stormwater, as related to subdivision and commercial development. The third stormwater meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. on February 23, 2012 at the Camden County Senior Center. Housing Rehabilitation Assistance

Camden County anticipates receiving CDBG Scattered Site (CDBG SS-11) funding from the State Division of Community Assistance and Investment; and Single Family Rehabilitation (NCHFA SFR 12) funding from the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency to assist low income homeowners make repairs to their houses. A third program offered through the CDBG program can provide assistance to hook-up households to public water systems.

The CDBG SS-11 assistance can be used to rehabilitate or replace seriously deteriorated structures, and is available for owner occupied households where total household income is 50% or less of the County's median household income (MHI), \$74,200. The deadline for receiving applications is March 15, 2012.

The NCHFA SFR-12 assistance can be used to rehabilitate moderately deteriorated structures (does not include manufactured homes), and is available for owner occupied households where 1) the total household income is 80% or less of the MHI (\$74, 200); and 2) includes either an elderly member (62 or older); a disabled member; or a child under age 6 living in the presence of lead based paint.

The Water Hook-up Program will pay for the water connection fee and the outside plumbing to the house, and is available for owner occupied households where total household income is 80% or less of the MHI (\$74, 200). Tenant households can qualify for assistance if the landlord also meets the low income criteria. The deadline for reviewing applications is March 30, 2012

Since each of these programs is competitive based on household and structural needs, the County cannot guarantee that every applicant will be eligible or receive assistance until all applications have been reviewed and ranked.

Dismal Swamp Welcome Center

Warmer weather and changes of the landscape, from drab to cheery, encourage each of us to venture out and increase our outdoor activities. The Dismal Swamp Welcome Center can assist you with any plans to visit areas in our state. With over 500 different brochures, maps and travel guides, you can find a great destination to enjoy history, recreation or just relax.

Many of Camden's residents are not aware of the trails to be enjoyed during the spring season here at the Dismal Swamp Area. To the immediate right, upon entering the Welcome and Rest Area, the Dismal Swamp Nature Trail provides an intimate brush with nature for a quarter mile trek through a wooded area adjacent to the historic Dismal Swamp Canal.

The Dismal Swamp Trail, a paved three mile trail between US Hwy 17 and the Dismal Swamp Canal, provides a great place to bike, hike or jog. With parking at both ends, near the Recycle Center on Hwy 343 or at the Dismal Swamp State Park, there is easy accessibility. The State Park (771-6593) also has 17 miles of old logging trails to explore and a half-mile boardwalk. The staff at the Welcome Center (771-8333) will be glad to loan adult bikes (4) for a ride on the paved trail and the State Park offers canoe, kayak and mountain bike rentals.

A special presentation to recognize the *Battle of South Mills* is planned for Sunday, April 15. The Dismal Swamp Canal opened to waterway traffic in 1805 and was considered a valuable asset during the Civil War. The Union forces attempted to capture control of the Canal and blow up the locks. The Confederate forces fought hard and sustained many injuries before retreating to fortifications 2 miles north at Joys Creek; the Union forces did not pursue and withdrew leaving the canal intact. Both sides claimed victory: the north because they captured the field, and the south because they prevented the



destruction of the Dismal Swamp Canal locks 3 miles northwest. Local historian Alex Leary will help to share the historical significance in a planned shared event with Museum of the Albemarle.



2012: Election Year in Camden County

2012 is a big election year in Camden County; because Camden County is a Unified Government we do not have Municipal Elections which means we only have elections every two years. In 2012 there is a Primary Election on May 8, a Second Primary Election (if needed) on June 26 and the General Election on November 6. A Primary is held to nominate a candidate to represent a political party in the General Election. Primary Elections are held in even-numbered years prior to the General Election. In 2012 Camden County's Primary ballot will have local, state and federal offices as well as a statewide referendum for a proposed change to the NC Constitution. Local offices for the ballot are: Register of Deeds, County Commissioner At-Large seat, County Commissioner Courthouse seat and County Commissioner South Mills seat. At the end of the candidate filing period only the incumbents had filed for these offices which means these local races will not appear on the May Primary ballot. State level offices are: Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Auditor, Commissioner of Agriculture, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Labor, Secretary of State, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Treasurer, NC State Senate District 1, NC House of Representatives District 1, three Court of Appeals Judges and two District 1 District Court Judges. The Federal offices are: US President and US House of Representatives District 3.

When you register to vote you declare your party affiliation, party affiliation determines the Primary in which you are eligible to vote. You may also register as unaffiliated (not affiliated with any recognized party). An Unaffiliated voter is currently allowed to vote in either the Democratic or Republican Primary. The individual party has the authority to permit Unaffiliated voters to vote in its primary. For the Primary Election the Unaffiliated voter must state the political party in whose primary he/she wishes to vote.

A General Election is a partisan election in which candidates are elected. All registered voters are eligible to vote in general elections. The General Election ballot will have the same local, state and federal offices as the Primary Election with the addition of two Board of Education Members and one District Soil and Water Supervisor. The candidates for these two offices run as non-partisan candidates.

The deadline for voter registration is twenty-five days before an election. You may register to vote in Camden County if you are: a citizen of the United States, 18 years old or older by the general election and a legal resident of Camden County for 30 days by the date of the next election. You must update your registration if you have moved to another address within Camden County since you registered to vote or have changed your name, or if you wish to change your party affiliation. Voter registration and updates can be made in person at the Camden County Board of Elections office located at 117 N NC 343 Camden, NC or by mail at Post Office Box 206 Camden, NC 27921.

A North Carolina resident who is qualified to vote but who misses the 25-dy deadline for voter registration may register and vote during the One-Stop Absentee Voting period. One-Stop voting for the May Primary will be on from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM Monday through Friday from April 19 through May 4 and Saturday, May 5 from 8:00 AM until 1:00 PM. This process is sometime referred to as "Same-Day Registration," but it is important to recognize that it is not permitted on Election Day itself.

To use this process, a citizen must (1) go to a One-Stop Voting site in the county of residence during the One-Stop Absentee Voting period, (2) fill out a voter registration application, and (3) provide proof of residency by showing the elections official an appropriate form of identification with the citizen's current name and address. The new registrant may vote ONLY at a One-Stop Absentee Voting site in the county of registration during One-Stop Absentee Voting and not on Election Day.


Northeast District 4-H Horse Bowl
