Good afternoon Mr. Smith. I have spent several hours this afternoon looking through our road files and online deeds. Accordingly, I can offer the following information:

- The right-of-way width adjacent the parcel in question is 50' (approximately 25' each way of center). I have attached the recorded right-of-way agreements for both Robert Lee McDaniels and Eric McDaniels stating such.
- The length of the road has apparently been a contentious topic over the last two decades. Although the official length we have on file is 1.0 miles, the fact that we simply only round to the nearest tenth can account for a 250' swing in either direction. This road has also endured several widening projects, both of which altered curve geometry and subsequently length. One would assume we took ownership of a public right-of-way extending to the water as it is alleged a ferry operated from this location which corresponds with the road's previous name of Ferry Road. It also seems that the plats for the property subdivided by Eric Mcdaniels concedes we own 535.44' form the NE corner which seemingly extends to the shoreline. Nonetheless, we can always claim right-of-way by maintenance (Section 4.03 of our Right of Way Manual) which would extend to the limits of the asphalt paving. This is consistent with a letter on file from Mrs. Gretchen Byrum (attached) which states "there was a nail in the edge of the concrete where our right-of-way ends".

On Tuesday, April 8th, we met in the Elizabeth City District Office to discuss the limits of State maintenance along SR-1205 – Shipyard Road. This letter is meant to summarize this meeting, as well as draw a conclusion to your inquiry.

While no specific information related to the official length of Shipyard Road could be immediately found, several pieces of evidence from our Secondary Road files indicate that we will currently claim ownership to the end of asphalt pavement. These documents, which have also been attached, are as follows:

- On March 21, 2006, David and Kristi Horger (then owners of the property located at 201 Shipyard Road), recorded a "Grant of License" with the Camden County Register of Deeds which allowed public access across their land to the Pasquotank River. The land they refer to is the strip between where State maintenance presumably ends and the water.
- In early 2009, Mr. Michael Malcolm (then owner of the property located at 201 Shipyard Road) erected a gate across the end of SR-1205, preventing public access to the Pasquotank River. He recorded a "Termination of License" with the Camden County Register of Deeds which he believed gave him the right to do so. As this gate stretched over our asphalt pavement, Mrs. Gretchen Byrum (then District One Engineer for the Department), sent a letter instructing him to move it back behind the edge of concrete. She determined that this area was behind our right-of-way.

It should be noted that the Department can also claim right-of-way by maintenance. As the road was paved to the edge of the concrete slab used as a boat ramp, we have transparently been allowed to maintain to this point with no prior objections.



Summary:

South Camden Fire Department is requesting approval from the Board of Commissioners to purchase two (2) E-One 1830 Commercial Tankers. This request is due to the current age of the existing tankers and the ability to purchase the equipment before a significant price increase goes into effect. The quote received from Fire Connections (the manufacturer) in July is for \$869,384. Since this amount is more than what the South Camden Fire Department has in their budget they will be required to apply for a loan to purchase the vehicles. SCFD received a financing proposal from Leasing 2 (Loan Company) on August 27th and received 3 options for financing. The goal is to finance this purchase for a period of seven (7) years making a down payment of \$246,780.54, a performance bond of \$3,477.54 from fund balance and receiving a pre-payment discount to pay in full and finance the remaining \$600,000.



Resolution 2021-10-01 Approving Financing Terms

WHEREAS, Camden County ("Borrower") has determined to undertake the financing of Two E-One 1830 Commercial Tankers ("Fire trucks"), and the Finance Officer has presented a proposal for the financing of such Fire trucks.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, as follows:

- 1. The Borrower hereby determines to finance the Fire trucks through Leasing 2 in accordance with the proposal dated August 27, 2021. The amount financed shall not exceed \$869,384, the interest rate shall not exceed 2.32% and the financing term shall not exceed seven (7) years from closing.
- 2. All financing contracts and all related documents for closing of the financing (the "Financing Documents") shall be consistent with the foregoing terms. All officers and employees of the County are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any Financing Documents, and to take all such further action as they may consider necessary or desirable, to carry out the financing as contemplated by the proposal and this resolution.
- 3. The Finance Officer is hereby authorized and directed to hold executed copies of the Financing Documents until the conditions for the delivery of the Financing Documents have been completed to such officer's satisfaction. The Finance Officer is authorized to approve changes to any Financing Documents previously signed by County officers or employees, provided that such changes shall not substantially alter the intent of such documents or certificates from the intent expressed in the forms executed by such officers. The Financing Documents shall be in such final forms as the Finance Officer shall approve, with the Finance Officer's release of any Financing Documents for delivery constituting evidence of such officer's final approval of the Document's final form.
- 4. The Borrower shall not take or omit to take any action the taking or omission of which shall cause its interest payments on this financing to be includable in the gross income for federal income tax purposes of the registered owners of the interest payment obligations. The Borrower hereby designates its obligations to make principal and interest payments under the Financing documents as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the purpose of Internal Revenue Code Section 265(b)(3).
- 5. The Borrower intends that the adoption of this resolution will be a declaration of the County's official intent to approve a banking relationship with Leasing 2 for this financing, and deposit accounts as needed as determined by the County Finance Officer in compliance with statutes.
- 6. All prior actions of Borrower officers in furthermore of the purposes of this resolution are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed. All other resolutions (or parts thereof) in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

The unsafe character of the building was such that decay, bad condition of walls, is likely to cause or contribute to blight, disease, vagrancy, or danger to children;

WHEREAS, Inspector sent proper written notice to Abode of Camden Inc. 187 Thomas Point Road Shiloh, NC 27974 describing the unsafe nature of the building and requesting prompt corrective action be taken within thirty (30) days;

WHEREAS Abode of Camden Inc. failed to take prompt corrective action and Inspector held a hearing after due notice was given to Abode of Camden Inc. on the 1st day of June, 2020 and ordered to demolish the building or take other necessary steps;

WHEREAS Abode of Camden Inc. timely appealed the Inspector's order before this Board pursuant to Section 150.22 (G)-(H);

WHEREAS the Board has conducted a quasi-judicial hearing on whether the Building at issue is unsafe and whether the Inspector's order should be affirmed, modified and affirmed, or revoked.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Building located at 1275 NC Hwy 343 S Shiloh, NC 27974 in Camden County, North Carolina is unsafe in that it constitutes a fire or safety hazard, is dangerous to life, health or property, is likely to cause or contribute to blight, disease, vagrancy, or danger to children.

WHEREAS, the Board has concluded by clear and convincing evidence, and due deliberation, after the evidentiary portion of the quasi-judicial hearing, the Building at issue is unsafe and the Inspector's Order should be affirmed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the order of the Inspector is hereby AFFIRMED.





A RESOLUTION BY THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN APPROVING THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) BETWEEN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLIAN AND LOCAL, GOVERNMENTS ON PROCEEDS RELATING TO THE SETTLEMENT OF OPIOID LITIGATION

WHEREAS, as of 2019, the opioid epidemic had taken the lives of more than 16,500 North Carolinians, torn families apart, and ravaged communities from the mountains to the coast; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has compounded the opioid crisis, increasing levels of drug misuse, addiction, and overdose death; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates the total "economic burden" of prescription opioid missuse alone in the United States is \$78.5 billion a year, including the costs of healthcare, lost productivity, addiction treatment, and criminal justice involvement; and

WHEREAS, certain counties and municipalities in North Carolina joined with thousands of local governments across the country to file lawsuit against opioid manufacturers and pharmaceutical distribution companies and hold those companies accountable for their misconduct; and

WHEREAS, representatives of local North Carolina governments, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, and the North Carolina Department of Justice have negotiated and prepared a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to provide for the equitable distribution of any proceeds from a settlement of national opioid litigation to the State of North Carolina and to individual local governments; and

WHEREAS, Local Governments and the State of North Carolina anticipate a settlement in the national opioid litigation to be forthcoming; and

WHEREAS, by signing onto the MOA, the state and local governments maximize North Carolina's share of opioid settlement funds to ensure the needed resources reach communities, once a negotiation is finalized, as quickly, effectively, and directly as possible; and

WHEREAS, it is advantageous to all North Carolinians for local governments, including Camden County and its citizens, to sign onto the MOA and demonstrate solidarity in response to the opioid epidemic, and to maximize the share of opioid settlement funds received both in the state and this county to help abote the harm; and WHEREAS, the MOA directs substantial resources over multiple years to local governments on the front lines of the opioid epidemic while ensuring that these resources are used in an effective way to address the crisis.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Carnden County hereby approves the Memorandum of Agreement Between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments on Proceeds Relating to the Settlement of Opioid Litigation, and any subsequent settlement funds that may come into North Carolina as a result of the opioid crisis. Purthermore, Canden County authorizes the County Manager (or County Attorney) to take such measures as necessary to comply with the terms of the MOA and receive any settlement funds, including executing any documents related to the allocation of opioid settlement funds and settlement of lawsuits related to this matter. 

The Camden County Board of Commissioners is pleased to support the Albemarle Regional Broadband Expansion Project.

The COVID-19 pandemic exposed just how dire the situation is for many areas – and just how integral broadband access is to meeting other vital needs, such as healthcare, education and workforce development, and business recruitment and expansion. North Carolina's Broadband Infrastructure Office (NC BIO) estimates that 25-40% of residents in the state's most rural and poorest counties lack access to the minimum 25Mbps download and 3Mbps upload broadband speeds recommended by the Federal Communication Commission (FCC). In addition, significant areas of the Albemarle region have only one choice of broadband service provider.

Without strong coordination of public and private broadband funding sources, leveraging of existing regional broadband assets, and inclusive strategic broadband planning led by the public sector, the Albemarle region may never bridge this broadband service gap. A strategic, county-by-county, regional approach is necessary to help local leaders identify the greatest broadband needs. The **Albemarle Commission Broadband Expansion Project** proposes, with the support of the NC Rural Center, to build upon regional broadband assets by working directly with leaders in each county and municipality to accomplish three main strategies:

- 1) Build a county-by-county strategy for working with broadband service providers (BSPs) to maximize the utility of state and federal broadband funds.
- 2) Explore county-level opportunities to use ARPA funds to build government-owned broadband networks that could be leveraged or leased by private BSPs to substantially upgrade broadband service in the region.
- 3) Structure a long-term system of accountability by which BSPs receiving these funds are accountable to county and/or municipal governments as a requirement for receiving county and municipal assistance.

It is our pleasure to support the **Albemarle Commission Broadband Expansion Project**, which will provide regional oversight to ensure that northeastern North Carolina is connected to this century's most vital infrastructure. Solving the broadband access challenge for the region will have a profound impact on access to healthcare resources, advanced education, workforce participation, and individual and community economic opportunity.





Dear Camden County Commissioners and County Manager Ken Bowman:

This letter highlights the North Carolina Forest Service's annual accomplishments for Camden County in fiscal year July 2020 - June 2021. The NCFS is responsible for the protection and development of all private and state woodlands in the county per general statutes. Camden County's forestland area consists of 80,177 acres as listed in the 2015 NCFIA survey. Of these acres, only 49,494 are nonindustrial private that we have jurisdiction over. At this time, I would like to take the opportunity to inform you of our program areas and the accomplishments we made in each area. My new Assistant County Ranger Anthony DeSocio came over from Martin County in June with 1 year of experience and training while Aaron Bishop transferred back to Currituck County as County Ranger. Our Forest Fire Equipment Operator Chanin Davis has left our agency and the position is vacant.

Fire Control

We had a low amount of fire response calls considering it was an average year weather wise. We responded to 15 calls with 6 of those being wildfires with 1 warning ticket being written. Other calls were false alarms and legal or illegal control burns. We had 819 Burning Permits written by local agents and acquired by landowners online. We have 3 Volunteer Fire Departments in the county, which continue to be a tremendous asset to us in wildfire suppression. Their quick initial attack with us minimizes fire damage and keeps fires small. Initial Attack Training is being planned for South Mills VFD when we can offer training again.

Forest Management

With help from our District Office staff in Elizabeth City; we prepared 14 management plans for Camden landowners consisting of 450 acres. These plans help landowners meet financial and personal objectives for their timberland. These plans address timber resources, wildlife, aesthetics, water quality, soil protection, and/or recreation opportunities. Using information in their management plans, Camden landowners contracted with tree planters for a total of 163 acres of harvested woodland that was replanted. We are also responsible for conducting survival checks of last year planting projects and land measurement of all projects funded with state funds using global positioning system instruments. We also collected 325 lbs. of seed for our State Nursery in Goldsboro and did a 4-acre hazard reduction burn for one of our landowners.

Water Quality Protection

We are also committed to randomly check on forestry logging operations. All forestry activities must adhere to Forest Practice Guidelines and Best Management Practices. These laws and regulations protect water quality and enable us to utilize forest resources in a sustainable manner. We conducted 50 inspections and re-inspections on loggers for 415 acres of forest harvesting activities in the county.

Information and Education

These programs are a vital part of our organization and they educate the public in forestry and the prevention of wildfires. Due to the Covid-19 virus; our agency cancelled programs and interaction with the public and we only conducted 1 virtual program on fire prevention at Grandy Primary School.

Urban Assistance and Pest Control

We provide Camden citizens with advice and support on shade trees, windbreaks, and insect disease control. Urban assistance will continue to be a priority as the population increases and more land is developed. In an effort to protect urban and forested areas, each year we conduct aerial and ground surveys for forest pest outbreaks. We continually work with cooperative agencies; NCSU Extension office for shade tree assistance and the North Carolina Department of Agriculture to monitor forest pest movements. They continue to work the Slow the Spread Project to reduce the gypsy moth population.

Other Services

We are also involved in overall emergency response in Camden County, the State of North Carolina, and the Southeast Compact. We stand ready for natural disaster recovery efforts such as hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, and ice storms.

Summary

I feel we had a good year in all program areas especially with position and program changes. I really appreciate the support of this board of commissioners and our other cooperators in helping us achieve this success. Minutes from Previous Meeting: The previous meeting was held through Webex. Minutes from previous meeting were presented. Motion to accept minutes made by Commissioner Tome White, seconded by Pete Aiken. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- 1. Risk and Needs Assessment was reviewed. The RFP was created as a result of the Risk and Needs Assessment. The RFP was approved for by email vote and sent out January 28th, 2021.
- 2. Camden JCPC Funding Plan Camden JCPC opted for the 2 year plan and this was voted on and passed in the January meeting.

New Business:

- 1. Monitoring Committee Update The Monitoring Committee met on January 27th, 2021. The committee reported that the files were well prepared in advance of the monitoring and that there were no conditions. Strengths were listed, that there was a dedicated director for the program, there was community involvement and that the school was an active participant. Student works sites are able to be maintained with the ASPCA and the Sheriff's Dept.. Marcia continues to interact with youth through the use of modern technology and there is good participation from the youth in the program. She has received positive feedback from the parents of youth involved in the program. She continues to have a strong working relationship with the DOJ and the Court Counselors. The files were in excellent order. The only weakness of the program is that referrals are low due to Covid-19
- 2. RFP The RFP is advertised with the Daily Advance and is one the Camden County Website for review. At the next meeting we will hear the grant proposals for the next 2 fiscal years.

Program Updates

- 1. Marcia Berry Currently working with 7 CK & Bears students thru Zoom and face to face meetings. Waiting for 4 HS referrals. Mr. Reaves spoke with Marcia about Teen Court and Youth Leadership opportunities as well as Raise the Age funding. No referrals for Teen Court currently however is taking referrals for Teen Court. One option until Teen Court is Citizen Circles. This may require additional training as well. Mr. Reaves spoke about getting kids involved through other groups and clubs. The suggestion was to link with another school re Teen Court involvement.
- 2. Area Consultant TreNiece Townes spoke about and thanked the committee for the quick response to the RFP vote via email. RFP due date is March 1, 2021. There was a Grant Writing Workshop on February 10, 2021 with approx.. 60 participants. No one from our area was present.
 - 3rd quarter accounting is coming up to advise as to where the program is financially and where funds need to be utilized. The Restitution Budget was discussed and there may be significant underspending in this area. Possible uses were suggested such as YMCA scholarships may be an option. This will be discussed with Marcia.
 - 2 Interstate Compact referrals to Camden. These are kids who have been adjudicated in another state. 1 is already working with Marcia. The other state will use their funds for restitution if the youth responds with community service.

TreNeice gave an update as to the progress with Raise The Age. Raise The Age has been ongoing for a year and there have been improvements in reducing youth in adult jails, access to services for adjudicated youth and also use of Teen Court for youth. Overall referrals for youth are down primarily due to the schools not being in regular classes.

TreNeice stated some statistics and stated that there were approx.. 12,349 complaints between Dec. 2019 and November 2020. Approx. 4107 entered the Juvenile Justice system. She also stated that while school attendance was affecting the overall numbers, there was an increase in high level felonies among 17 & 18 year olds.
