The Camden County Board of Commissioners held a joint meeting with the South Mills Water Association on July 11, 2018 at 7:00 PM at the South Mills Ruritan Club.

WELCOME & CALL TO ORDER

Manager Ken Bowman welcomed those in attendance. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Clayton Riggs at 7:15 PM. Also Present: Vice Chairman Tom White, Commissioners Randy Krainiak and Garry Meiggs. Absent: Commissioner Ross Munro

Staff Present: Manager Ken Bowman, Clerk to the Board Karen Davis, Finance Officer Stephanie Humphries, Public Works Director David Credle.

Motion to approve the agenda as presented.

Mr. Bowman led the discussion which included the following:

Background

- > The current Agreement was entered into on May 12, 2011
- > Two Meetings have taken place this year:
 - January 30th and June 13th
- Recitals per Agreement
- > Areas of concern with the current Agreement
 - Reserve Capacity and Rates
 - Sales Price for Treated Water
 - Concern of not having the capacity for future growth
 - Providing water to the citizens / Camden Plantation / Commerce Park

Current Agreement Water Purchasing Options Section Fifteen:

- Option 1: Reserve Capacity
 - Purchase guaranteed Reserve Capacity at a reduced Bulk Water rate
- > Option 2: Purchase Water As Needed
 - Purchase Bulk Water at the standard Bulk Water rate

Option 1: Reserve Capacity

Association may choose to reserve a specific level of capacity (Reserve Capacity) in 50,000 gpd increments;

Requirements:

➤ Association shall pay a reserve capacity recovery fee:

Required by State Statutes to be computed and charged uniformly to all reserve capacity customers (residential, commercial, bulk) at time of commitment to reserve capacity.

- ➤ The Capacity recovery fee shall be \$2,500
- > 50,000 gallons per day minimum Capacity Reserve requirement

Option 1: Calculated Costs

The Reserve Capacity fee shall be \$2,500 for 360 Gallons per Day to a single family detached residence (Meter to residence)

Since water is billed at 1000 GPD:

1000 / 360 GPD = 2.777 x \$2,500 = \$6,945

- 50,000 gallons minimum Capacity Reserve (138 Homes)
 \$6,945 x 50 = \$347,250
- Reserve Capacity fee is recouped by charges to Association's new connections \$4,000 x 2.77 x 50 = \$554,000
- ▶ Profit of \$206,750 stays with the Association

Option 2: Purchase Water As Needed

Solution May choose to purchase Bulk Water as needed in cases of shortage in supply. <u>Requirements:</u>

- Purchase treated water as needed using the Standard Rate
- There is no guarantee that this water will be available for future use
- Association keeps all collected connection fees

Option 2: Calculated Costs

- No Reserve Capacity fee
- No minimum purchase
- All connection fees charged by SMWA stays with the Association
- Association Pays the contracted Standard Bulk Water Rate

Considerations

Option 1: Reserve Capacity

Benefits

- Reserved capacity guarantees that this water will be available in the future
- Discounted rate

Disadvantage

• Requires Association to begin purchasing water after two years without bulk water purchases.

Option 2: Purchase Water As Needed

Benefits

- No requirement for the Association to reserve capacity
- No requirement to begin purchasing water

Disadvantage

- No guarantee of water supply availability
- Slightly higher Bulk Rate for water purchased

Development

- Camden Plantation
- Commerce Park

Current Agreement

Sales Price of Treated Water Section Sixteen:

Reserved Capacity Bulk Water Rate

Cost per 1,000 gallons includes:

- Annual Operating Cost of treatment plant
- Debt
- 50% of Depreciation
- 5% Overhead Fee
- Standard Bulk Water Rate

Cost per 1,000 gallons includes:

- Annual Operating Cost of treatment plant
- Debt
- Depreciation
- 5% Overhead Fee
