An Ordinance Amending the Camden County Code of Ordinances

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS as follows:

Article I: Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 151 of the Camden County Code of Ordinances of Camden County, North Carolina, which was originally adopted by the County Commissioners on December 15, 1997, and subsequently amended and as otherwise incorporated into the Camden County Code.

Article II. Construction

For purposes of this Ordinance, underlined words (<u>underline</u>) shall be considered as additions to existing Ordinance language and strikethrough words (strikethrough) shall be considered deletions to existing language. New language of proposed ordinance shall be shown in italics (*italics*) and underlined.

Article III. Amend Chapter 151 as amended of the Camden County Code which shall read as follows:

§ 151.347 SPECIFIC STANDARDS

(U) The following development and design standards shall apply to all Internet Sweepstakes Café's:

(1) If food is served, the establishment shall meet all the requirements of the Albemarle Regional Health Services or appropriate state agency requirements.

(2) There shall be no consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises to include parking areas.

(3) The gaming operation shall be visible and open to the store front.

(4) All exterior windows shall not exceed a window tint of 35%.

(5) The maximum number of player terminals shall be shall be made as a condition of the Special Use Permit. No poker or slot style machines shall be allowed.

(6) The hours of operations shall be made as a condition of the Special Use <u>Permit.</u>

(7) Firearms shall be prohibited in the establishment.

(8) The establishment shall be limited to patrons and employees at least eighteen (18) years of age.

(9) There shall be no other Café located within a ¹/₂ mile of each other. The measurement of distance shall be a straight line from the closest point of the building at which the operations are located.

§ 151.600 DEFINITIONS OF BASIC TERMS

INTERNET SWEEPSTAKES CAFÉ. Any business enterprise, whether as a principal or an accessory use, where persons utilize electronic machines, including but not limited to computers and gaming terminals, to conduct games of chance, including sweepstakes, and where cash, merchandise or other items of value are redeemed or otherwise distributed, whether or not the value of such distribution is determined by electronic games played or by predetermined sweepstakes, electronic gaming operations or cyber cafés, who have a finite pool of winners. This does not include any lottery approved by the State of North Carolina.
