### **MINUTES**

The regular meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners was held on Monday, January 5, 2009 at 8:00 a.m. in the Historic Courtroom, Camden, North Carolina. The following members were present:

Chairman Philip Faison called the meeting to order and called upon Commissioner Sandy Duckwall to give the invocation and lead those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance.

# PRESENTATION – Joy Greenwood – Dismal Swamp State Park:

Dismal Swamp State Park & Rec Attendant Joy Greenwood, spoke to the Board regarding

- Undeveloped Park was established in 1974 and due to community interest for access to the state park and the new state park came to be in the late 1990's
- Currently14,000 acres and more land will be added
- Visitor's Center with offices for staff, meeting room and environmental education
- Primary mission is to educate the public
- Concerned regarding Dismal Swamp Hydrogeology
- Serves community with estimated 45,000 to 60,000 visitors and expect 100,000 within three (3) year range
- People use park to bike, hike, bird watch, observe wild life and butterflies
- Will soon have one half mile of boardwalk erected in the park
- Process of landscaping and providing picnic tables
- Future plans for bike and kayak rentals

## PRESENTATION – Mike Etheridge – Solid Waste – Convenience Sites

Director of Solid Waste Management Michael Etheridge presented a proposal from Pasquotank County for the cost to operate the Camden County convenience sites.

# New Business - Cooperative Extension Office - CAMA Grant Pre-Application Proposal

Cooperative Extension Agent Mark Powell requested permission to move forward with the pre-application process for a CAMA grant in the amount of \$226,800.00, with a match of \$11,550.00 for the Treasure Point 4-H Camp.

Following discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to approve the Cooperative Extension pre-application for the CAMA grant.

# New Business - Rezoning of South 343 Old Trap Property

Commissioner Melvin Jeralds stated he and Commissioner Garry Meiggs met with the citizens in the Old Trap Community Building who would like to have their property rezoned as it was prior to the 2002 countywide rezoning. It is now zoned neighborhood commercial and the property owners would like to have it rezoned back to R-2 with the exception of the two (2) corner lots on Wharf Road which will remain as commercial and Commissioner Melvin Jeralds asked that staff proceed with this request.

Commissioner Melvin Jeralds made a motion to send the properties located on South 343 Old Trap area to the Planning Board for review. The motion passed with Commissioners Melvin Jeralds, Sandy Duckwall, Garry Meiggs, Michael McLain and Chairman Philip Faison voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

# <u>New Business - Declaring Surplus and Selling of Surplus Property on GovDeals - Morrisette House</u>

Commissioner Sandy Duckwall made a motion to declare the brick Morrisette House located at 118 North NC343 as surplus. The motion passed with Commissioners Melvin Jeralds, Sandy Duckwall, Garry Meiggs, Michael McLain and Chairman Philip Faison voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

The motion passed with Commissioners Melvin Jeralds, Sandy Duckwall, Garry Meiggs, Michael McLain and Chairman Philip Faison voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

# **Commissioner's Report**

Commissioner Sandy Duckwall reported on the Jail Commission meeting with the auditor and there were no concerns regarding the audit. The Jail Board discussed change orders and that all change orders will go through the Jail Board. Commissioner Sandy Duckwall contacted US Marshall's service and is in the process of working with US Marshall to house federal prisoners to offset the cost of the jail.

Commissioner Melvin Jeralds referred to an article in *County Lines* listing the proposed legislative goals and Taxation and Finance, Revenue Options and Protection is number one priority for the NCACC.

Chairman Philip Faison reported that Charles Franklin has given his resignation as the Albemarle Mental Health Director; the budget has been cut from state and resulted in job cuts; and the twenty three (23) hour crisis center has been closed.

### **County Manager's Report**

County Manager Randell Woodruff reported on the following:

- Received letter from Mediacom Cable regarding upgrades are completed and seventeen (17) new channels added on the cable lineup.
- Received \$37,289.00 from CDBG for infrastructure that was applied for in 2008 to be used to assist county residents with the \$4,000.00 water or sewer hook up fee.
- Intent to Apply has been submitted to the Rural Center to receive additional funding for water and sewer needs where the green commerce park is being proposed. A grant application will be forthcoming in the near future.
- Received notification from DENR that the State Park has acquired an additional (89) acres that will become part of the Dismal Swamp State Park, which was property owned by Frances Wilson on Horseshoe Road.
- Met with Senator Basnight and Representative Owens; a presentation was given by a representative from General Electric; talked about UNC study; and recommended that next step is to develop a plan for funding a large facility. Contacting Golden Leaf for funding.
- Joint Meeting with Currituck Board of Commissioner on January 12, 2009 at 4:00 p.m.
- Golden Leaf meeting on January 7, 2009.
- Stormwater workshop on January 8, 2009.
- Recommend that the Pay Study be on the February 2, 2009 agenda for discussion.

## **Other Matters**

Planning Director Dan Porter spoke regarding trucks not able to cross the Scotland Road Bridge due to load limits. Mr. Porter stated he received a letter from bridge division doing the technical work and they are deciding if they should put a culvert under the bridge and the state is reviewing all bridges in the state as to the conditions and they are not sure whether the Scotland Road Bridge has been evaluated or not but if it has been evaluated, the posting for the weight limit on the bridge can not be changed. If the bridge has to be replaced with a culvert, then the monies would come from the Secondary Roads Program.

Commissioner Melvin Jeralds questioned Mr. Porter regarding the status of the installation of warning lights in front of the courthouse complex.

Mr. Porter stated that he has not had a response from NCDOT and will call Chad Edge.
