

The motion passed with Commissioners Jeffrey Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Consideration of Agenda

County Manager Randell Woodruff asked that the following items be added to the agenda: *Item VIII. 1. Courthouse Renovation Project Update; Delete South Camden Water and Sewer District Board of Directors Item F. Closed Session; Add Item X. New Business, 7. Resolution No. 2006-03-01 NC Governor's Highway Safety Program Checkpoint Equipment Grant; and Item X. New Business, 8. USDA Loan for Courthouse Renovation – Authorize Loan Amount.*

Commissioner Mike Andrews made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. The motion passed with Commissioners Jeffrey Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Public Hearing - Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

Commissioner Mike Andrews made a motion to go into public hearing to receive comments from the public regarding the Camden County Capital Improvement Plan. The motion passed with Commissioners Jeffrey Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Chairman Jeralds called for any comments from the public.

Hearing no comments, Commissioner Mike Andrews made a motion to go out of public hearing. The motion passed with Commissioners Jeffrey Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Ordinance No. 2006-02-01 – Rezoning Application (UDO 2005-11-42) Ricky Edwards & Garry Meiggs

At the March 6, 2006 Commissioners meeting, the Board voted 4-0 to approve Ordinance No. 2006-02-01. Commissioner Carolyn Riggs was attending a conference in Washington, DC.

Pursuant to § 153A-45. Adoption of ordinances.

To be adopted at the meeting at which it is first introduced, an ordinance or any action having the effect of an ordinance (except the budget ordinance, any bond order, or any other ordinance on which a public hearing must be held before the ordinance may be adopted) must receive the approval of all the members of the board of commissioners. If

the ordinance is approved by a majority of those voting but not by all the members of the board, or if the ordinance is not voted on at that meeting, it shall be considered at the next regular meeting of the board. If it then or at any time thereafter within 100 days of its introduction receives a majority of the votes cast, a quorum being present, the ordinance is adopted. (1963, c. 1060, ss. 1, 1 1/2; 1965, cc. 388, 567, 1083, 1158; 1967, c. 495, s. 2; 1969, c. 36, s. 1; 1971, c. 702, ss. 1-3; 1973, c. 822, s. 1.)

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs stated that she is not opposed to rezoning application – UDO 2005-11-42, if certain conditions are met. The way Ordinance No. 2006-02-01 is currently written, the county is potentially open for the responsibility to educate more school children. The county could be protected by having an ordinance in place that limited the development to ages 55 and older, of which the developer has stated that is what they want to do. Commissioner Carolyn Riggs further expressed her concerns that the Board can not perceive what could happen with the development and controlling the number of students in the school system. In order to be able to control that an ordinance need to be in place that will bind the county to those concerns. Commissioner Carolyn Riggs questioned the County Attorney if it was possible to have an age restricted ordinance in place for the Boards review within two (2) weeks.

County Attorney John S. Morrison stated it was possible to have a draft age restricted subdivision ordinance, and advised that such ordinances have been held unconstitutional. It would be a political decision of the Board to pass such an ordinance, but the Board can not mandate that a developer use the age restricted subdivision. Age restricted subdivisions are generally designed to be attractive to the developers by allowing an increased density. Mr. Morrison further advised that the ordinance before the Board at this time was a rezoning and not approval of a subdivision.

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs asked the Board to reconsider their position due to overcrowding of the schools.

Chairman Melvin Jeralds called Planning Director Dan Porter to explain that Ordinance No. 2006-02-01 is a rezoning and not an approval of a subdivision.

Planning Director Dan Porter stated that is correct and conditions can be put on a subdivision plat at the time it is submitted to the Board for approval.

Commissioner Jeffrey Jennings made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 2006-02-01. The motion passed with Commissioner Jeffrey Jennings, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; Commissioner Carolyn Riggs voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Approved Ordinance No. 2006-02-01 reads as follows:

Ordinance No. 2006-02-01

**An Ordinance
Amending the Camden County
Zoning Map
Camden County, North Carolina**

Article I: Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Zoning Map of Camden County, North Carolina, which was originally adopted by the County Commissioners on December 20, 1993, and subsequently amended.

Article II. Amendment to Zoning Map

The Official Zoning Map of Camden County, North Carolina, which was adopted on December 20, 1993, and subsequently amended, is hereby amended as follows:

The property currently shown in the Camden County Tax Assessor's Office as PIN's 03-8971-00-21-2552, is hereby re-zoned from General Use District (GUD) to Planned Unit Development (PUD).

Article III. Penalty

1. Violations of the provision of this Ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements, including violations of any conditions and safeguards established in connection with grants of variances or Special Use or Conditional Use Permits, shall constitute a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to five-hundred (\$500) dollars or a maximum thirty (30) days imprisonment as provided in G. S. 14-4.
2. Any act constituting a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance or a failure to comply with any of its requirements, including violations of any conditions and safeguards established in connection with the grants of variances or Special Use or Conditional Use Permits, shall also subject the offender to a civil penalty of one-hundred (\$100) dollars for each day the violation continues. If the offender fails to pay the penalty within ten (10) days after being cited for a violation, the penalty may be recovered by the county in a civil action in the nature of debt. A civil penalty may not be appealed to the Board of Adjustment if the offender was sent a final notice of violation in accordance with Section 2203 and did not take an appeal to the Board of Adjustment within the prescribed time.
3. This Ordinance may also be enforced by any appropriate equitable action.
4. Each day that any violation continues after notification by the administrator that such violation exists shall be considered a separate offense for purposes of the penalties and remedies specified in this section.
5. Any one, all or any combination of the foregoing penalties and remedies may be used to enforce this Ordinance.


Article IV. Severability

If any language in this Ordinance is found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction or other entity having such legal authority, then only the specific language held to be invalid shall be affected and all other language shall be in full force and effect.

Article V. Effective Date

This Ordinance is effective upon adoption.







Waverly Sawyer, 117 Havenwood Drive, stated that according to the NC Home Builders Association, houses pay for themselves and will provide the Board with the report.


Chairman Jeralds received the report into the record.


