The regular meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners was held Monday, June 20, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. in the Camden County Courthouse, Courthouse Complex, Camden, NC. The following members were present:

Chairman Jeralds called the meeting to order. Commissioner Andrews gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.



The Proclamation reads as follows:

### **Public Comments**

Chairman Jeralds called for any comments from the public.

Julian Robert Bray, US 158, Camden, of Bray's House Moving and Equipment, stated that during a recent Commissioners meeting Bray's Moving name came up several times regarding unpaid taxes, and why was the county doing business with Bray's Moving.

Mr. Bray stated he owned eighteen (18) houses in Camden County, and out of those eighteen (18) houses there are seven (7) children in the school system; three (3) are his grandchildren, and is not overburdening the school system. Mr. Bray further stated he is a founding member of the Education Foundation, which brought the tax free QZAB money to Camden County to renovate the schools, a charter and active member of the Lions Club, and a past member and past Chairman of the Camden County Board of Adjustment. Mr. Bray stated he and his family have served Camden County since the early 1900's, and takes offense that as a property owner all these years his name came up twice at least, if not three times regarding unpaid taxes.

Commissioner Andrews offered Mr. Bray a public apology.

Mr. Bray stated he had no hard feelings, and accepted Commissioners Andrews' apology.

Hearing no further comments from the public, Chairman Jeralds proceeded with the meeting.

### **Consideration of Minutes**

Chairman Jeralds stated due to several consecutive meetings during the budget process and the Budget Hearing, the meeting minutes will be laid over until the July 5, 2005 for consideration.

### **Consideration of Agenda**

Chairman Jeralds added *Item X. New Business, N. Budget Amendments; Item X. New Business, O. Discussion of Salaries for Commissioners – Possible Action*, and convene a *South Camden Water and Sewer District Board of Directors meeting for consideration of Budget Amendments*.

Commissioner Jennings made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

### **Public Hearing – Ordinance No. 2005-06-02 Rezoning Application UDO 2005-04-01 Quality Crab Co. Inc.**

Commissioner Clayton Riggs made a motion to go into public hearing to receive comments from the public regarding Ordinance No. 2005-06-02. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Planning Director Dan Porter stated the Planning Board met on May 18, 2005 and voted 5-0 to recommend approval for this application to rezone from Mixed Single Family Residential (R2)/Commercial Fishing Overlay District to Marine Commercial (MC) with conditions as noted in the Findings of Facts..

This Ordinance was introduced and set for public hearing at the June 6, 2005 Commissioner meeting and advertised for public hearing in the Daily Advance.

David Pureza, Twiford Law Firm, representing Quality Crab Co., explained the existing operation, and was present to answer questions.

Charles Busby, Attorney for Robert White of Frog Island Seafood, spoke in opposition of Ordinance No. 2005-06-02..

Terry Rose, 119 Edgewater Drive, spoke in favor of Ordinance No. 2005-06-02.

Following discussion, Commissioner Clayton Riggs made a motion to close public hearing regarding Ordinance No. 2005-06-02. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

**Consideration of Ordinance No. 2005-06-02 - Rezoning Application UDO 2005-04-01 Quality Crab Co. Inc.**

Chairman Jeralds stated the comments made during the public hearing would be taken into consideration, and this matter would be placed on the July 5, 2005 agenda.

**Code Enforcement – Monthly Report**

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs referred to the Code Enforcement Report and questioned which house on Milltown Road was in violation because there were two (2) houses side by side in violation, and if one was condemned, why the other one wasn't condemned.

Planning Director Dan Porter stated he will check into the matter.

**Tax Office – Military Refund – Thomas D. Tarrants**

Commissioner Clayton Riggs made a motion to approve Thomas D. Tarrants refund request of \$346.99 due to active duty in the military and as a legal resident of Florida. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

**Tax Office – Estimated Property Values – Real & Personal**

Tax Administrator Mary Rhodes stated the estimated property values – real and personal- is a required yearly record for the Tax Office when the tax rate is set and approved by the Board.

Commissioner Jennings made a motion to accept the estimated property values as submitted by the Tax Administrator. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

**Resolution No. 2005-06-07 – A Resolution of the Camden County Board of Commissioners Regarding Increasing the State Cigarette Tax to Support County Medicaid Relief**

Resolution No. 2005-06-07 urges the General Assembly to enact a significant cigarette tax increase with a substantial portion of that tax to be used to begin a phase-out of required county contributions to fund Medicaid costs.

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2005-06-07. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Approved Resolution No. 2005-06-07 reads as follows:

**Resolution No. 2005-06-07**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
REGARDING INCREASING THE STATE CIGARETTE TAX  
TO SUPPORT COUNTY MEDICAID RELIEF**

**WHEREAS**, only the states of New York and North Carolina require county governments to participate in all the costs of Medicaid, and

**WHEREAS**, the state of New York recently took action to lower the costs of Medicaid to its counties, and

**WHEREAS**, Medicaid costs for counties are far outstripping county governments' ability to provide for those increases through the traditional source of flexible revenue (i.e. property tax), and

**WHEREAS**, Camden County will spend \$280,000 in 2004-05 for Medicaid which equates to 6.2 cents on the property tax rate, and

**WHEREAS**, North Carolina counties have no opportunity under federal and state law to control Medicaid expenditures, and

**WHEREAS**, a plan to completely phase out required county Medicaid expenditures is desirable, and

**WHEREAS**, cigarette smoking contributes to health problems which increase Medicaid costs, and


**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina has the lowest cigarette tax in the nations, and

**WHEREAS**, an increase in the state cigarette tax could yield significant funds to reduce the county share of Medicaid.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Camden County Board of Commissioners hereby urges the General Assembly of North Carolina to enact a significant cigarette tax increase with a substantial portion of that tax to be used to begin a phase-out of required county contributions to fund Medicaid costs.

**FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution be presented to members of the General Assembly.

**Planning Department – Greenway/Blueway Plan**

Planning Director Dan Porter stated the Paths of Pasquotank Committee, comprised of representatives from Elizabeth City, Pasquotank, Perquimans and Camden counties, desire to obtain technical assistance to develop a master plan for interconnected pathways linking to the East Coast Greenway.

Dave Copley, Chair of the Greenway/Blueway Group in Pasquotank County, stated the assistance is from the Rails, Trails and Conservation Program of the National Park Service and does not require a monetary commitment, but requires a letter of support from each county to endorse the project. Mr. Copley asked Camden to support the joint application of the greenway/blueway master plan to the Rivers, Trails and Conservation Assistance Program to develop a master plan for an interconnected greenway and bikeway network through northeastern North Carolina.

Commissioner Jennings asked who would maintain the greenway/blueway project.

Mr. Copley stated the project would be maintained locally by local volunteers and the National Park Service does not own or maintain the greenway/blueway project.

Commissioner Andrews made a motion to support a joint application of the greenway/blueway master plan. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings,

Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jeralds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

**Discussion of Salaries for Camden County Board of Commissioners – Possible Action**

Chairman Jeralds read the following statement into the record:

*"On June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2005, the Board of Commissioners approved the 2005-2006 budget. In that budget was an increase for Commissioners to receive \$500.00 per year. For any of you that attended our budget workshops know that we never discussed an increase for Commissioners. We spent about eleven (11) hours working on the budget. The updated version of the budget was given to us just prior to our June 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, which I will verify through our Clerk. (Chairman Jearlds asked the Clerk if that was correct and the Clerk replied "yes, the Board never saw the updated version of the budget until sitting down for the meeting the night of June 13<sup>th</sup>."") The updated version of the budget was given to us just prior to our June 13<sup>th</sup> meeting which was to include all budget changes that the Board had made. The \$500.00 per year increase was in the changes. This was placed in the report by the Manager and Finance Officer after being suggested by one of the Commissioners. Through the lack of communication it was not brought to our attention that this was included in the paperwork that we had just received. A mistake was made; not intentionally, and it is embarrassing to all involved, and I recommend that we change Board of Commissioners salaries back what they are now, to the 2004-2005 scale."*

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs read the following statement into the minutes:

*"Recently this Board passed a budget by majority vote that supported an increase in the salary for the Commissioners. My vote did not support the passage of the budget for other reasons. I would like to say that my position on the salary increase should in no way be perceived to mean that the amount of raise built into the budget would not be earned due to the time and effort that is required of someone serving in the capacity of a Commissioner. What I do want to make clear is that I realize that we are in tight fiscal condition. A tax raise of some amount, while unfortunate did have to occur. I do believe a pay raise should be implemented for Commissioners when commercial business increases Camden's tax revenues. I believe this increase should occur whether I am fortunate enough to be a sitting Commissioner or not. What I did do was to vote to support a Salary Resolution for the county's employees, Commissioners included. In all of the salary discussions that went on in the workshops never was the Commissioners salary mentioned. I was present at every workshop for the full length of the workshop. Commissioner Andrews did make a motion to reduce the Commissioner's salary during the regular Board Meeting after the workshop. I did vote against that because being unaware of the increase I was under the impression that the motion was to reduce the basic salary of \$350.00. I know that I earn above and beyond the amount of \$350.00 per month, the salary for FY2004-2005. I am not opposed to the payment for attending the extra meetings, required, as there are many. My opposition is to increase the basic salary."*

Commissioner Andrews stated that he made the motion during the budget work session to cut the Commissioners monthly salaries by ten percent (10%). Commissioner Andrews also stated he did not vote to increase the budget, and did not vote to increase the Commissioners salaries. Commissioner Andrews further stated there is a lot of out of pocket expense, loss time from work, phone bills and everything else, and that the only discussion held regarding Commissioners salaries was cutting it.

Commissioner Carolyn Riggs made a motion to approve the Board of Commissioners salaries at the 2004-2005 scale. The motion passed with Commissioners Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Andrews and Chairman Jearlds voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

**Other Matters**




