Chairman Garry Meiggs called to order the November 4, 2013 meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners at 7:02 PM. Chairman Meiggs acknowledge that Commissioner Riggs was joining the meeting via teleconference.

## **Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance**

Vice Chairman Michael McLain gave the invocation, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **Presentations**

Item 3.A- Stormwater Review

Dwayne Hinson, technician for Albemarle/Pasquotank SWCD, gave a presentation reviewing current conditions and history of stormwater drainage in Northeast North Carolina and Camden County.

Item 3.B- Camden County Public Library Report

County Librarian Linda Van Sistine-Yost gave a brief report update on the Camden County Public Library.

# **Old Business**

Item 4,A- One Mill Park Demolition

Planning Director Dan Porter came before the Board to present the three quotes received for demolition and clearing of the One Mill Park property.

Vice Chairman McLain made a motion to accept the lowest responsive bidder, for \$11,500, and gave the County Manager permission to sign the contract. At 7:52pm, the motion passed 4-1, with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, and Clayton Riggs voting aye; Commissioner Randy Krainiak voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Item 4.B- Camden Historic Museum Project- Proposed Floor Plan

County Manager Michael Renshaw presented the following information to the Board:

- During its regular meeting on January 3, 2012, the Board of Commissioners directed the County Manager to explore available options concerning converting the previous Public Works building located on North HWY 343 adjacent to the Historic Jail into a Camden County Historical Museum. Due to the existing condition of the building's roof, the immediate direction was to replace the roof with a metal roof consistent with the existing Historic Courthouse roof material.
- Following several meetings with the Camden Historical Museum Planning Committee and County staff, the County Manager requested a design proposal and construction cost estimate for the renovation of the proposed Camden Historical Museum. Hyman-Robey, a local engineering firm, submitted the attached proposal for professional services.
- Included within this proposal are the following elements: 1) Building Design to include schematic design, construction design, required construction documentation, and preliminary cost estimate, 2) Site Design, to include boundary and topographical surveys and site plan design. Hyman-Robey proposes to perform this work for a fee of \$20,500 (\$17,720 for Building Design Process and \$2,780 for Site Design Process).

- The attached draft floor plan has been reviewed by members of the Planning Committee and county staff. This proposed floor plan will allow for the movement of Board of Elections out of the Historic Jail and into a renovated office space, providing much needed voting space for Board of Elections as well as allowing the Historic Jail to be used entirely for the display of historic artifacts. In addition, approximately half the available floor space of the proposed museum (approximately 1,100 sq ft) will be renovated for use as museum display space. A doorway along the west wall (opposite the Historic Jail) will allow Museum patrons to easily walk between both buildings.
- In addition to the attached fee proposal for building and site design services, Hyman-Robey has also submitted the attached Preliminary Engineer's Cost Estimate for building and site renovations. The sub-total for building renovations is estimated to be \$151,486. The sub-total for site improvements/renovations is estimated to be \$24,320. Hyman-Robey is estimating a total project cost (engineering design, building renovations, and site improvements) of \$193,386.60. This total includes a 10% contingency of \$17,580.60.

Commissioner Sandra Duckwall made a motion to approve the floor plan as presented. At 8:18pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Item 5.A- CDBG Close Out Public Hearing

Vice Chairman McLain made a motion to go into public hearing. Item 5.B- Public Meeting Sketch Plan Green Meadows- 9 Lots Major Subdivision (UDO 2013-08-04)

Code Enforcement and Permitting Officer Dave Parks came before the Board to present are Planning Staffs findings with recommendations and supporting documents for Sketch Plan Green Meadows, a 9 lot Major Subdivision located off Pudding Ridge Road in South Mills Township. Neighborhood meeting held August 27, 2013 and TRC inputs at Sketch Plan received by staff. The Planning Board met on September 18, 2013 and recommended approval of the Sketch Plan for Green Meadows (UDO 2013-08-04) with the comments & recommendations as stated in Staff Findings on a 6-0 vote.

There were no public comments.

Commissioner Riggs made a motion to come out public hearing. Item 5.C- Special Use Permit (UDO 2013-09-02) from Invenergy for Meteorological Tower over 35 feet

Commissioner Duckwall made a motion to go into public hearing. At 8:30pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Clerk to the Board of Commissioners Ashley Honaker swore in Dave Parks and April Montgomery.

Mr. Parks stated for the Board that in December 2010, Invenergy was granted a zoning permit for the construction of a temporary meteorological tower located off Cowpen road (Sawyer parcel) in the Hales Lake area. Zoning permits only valid for one year with a possible one year extension upon request. Invenergy applied for and was granted the one year extension to expire December 2012. Invenergy still desires the utilization of the tower and have applied for the Special Use Permit to make it a more permanent structure while working on a possible wind farm in the Hales Lake area. Application was reviewed by the Planning Board on September 18, 2013 and after presentation from staff and some discussion the Special Use Permit was recommended for approval with the conditions as stated in the Findings of Facts on a 6-0 vote.

There were no public comments.

Commissioner Riggs made a motion to come out public hearing. At 8:33pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Item 5.D- Ordinance No 2013-09-01; Proposed Amendments to Chapter 151 (Unified Development Ordinance) to the Camden County Code of Ordinances

Commissioner Duckwall made a motion to go into public hearing. At 8:34pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Mr. Parks explained to the Board that Mr. Leo Royer (property owner Camden Point Shores) has applied for a text amendment to Chapter 151 (Unified Development Ordinance) to allow for an accessory use on property without the principle use (property zoned residential- principle use would be the house and an accessory use would be an outbuilding (shed, garage). Staff drafted prosed ordinance amendment with Mr. Royer's input. Proposed amendment was reviewed by the Planning Board on September 18, 2013 and after discussion with staff recommended approval on a 6-0 vote.

There was no public comments.

Vice Chairman McLain made a motion to come out public hearing. Mr. Porter presented to the Board that The Albemarle Commission and Albemarle RPO, participating local governments, and its subcontractor Alta/Greenways, has prepared the Albemarle Regional Bicycle Plan.

At 8:55pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Item 6.B- Economic Improvement Council Community Service Block Grant Application

Lakitra Claude with Camden's EIC Office came before the Board to express that the EIC is pleased to announce the continued funding of the Community Services Block Grant Program for FY14-15. Funding is for Family Self-Sufficiency: \$281,576.

Commissioner Duckwall made a motion to approve the CSBG Application as presented. At 9:00pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.

Item 6.C- Movement of Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) Program Coordinator to the Sheriff's Office

County Manager Mike Renshaw came before the Board and presented the following information:

- Since 2004 the Camden County JCPC program has been physically housed and under the oversight/supervision of the Camden Cooperative Extension Office. The JCPC Coordinator, who is responsible for coordinating community programs and activities for participating juveniles, is a grant-funded County employee and as such is subject to supervision and administration in accordance with the County Personnel Policy.
- While the JCPC program has been successful under the oversight and management of the NC Cooperative Extension Service Camden County Center, Sheriff Perry has proposed moving the program under the authority of the Camden Sheriff's Office. Sheriff Perry believes that his experience and professional knowledge of the juvenile justice system, in addition to the resources and expertise of his deputies and staff, would better serve the program needs of Camden County juveniles. Additional law enforcement related grant funding sources might also be available to the JCPC program through a variety of state and federal sources if the program were under the direction of the Sheriff's Office.
- The County Manager has consulted with Nancy Hodges, Eastern Area Representative of Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice concerning the possible movement of JCPC to the Sheriff's Office. Ms. Hodges advised the County Manager that she believes the program could be successful under the authority of the Sheriff's Office and explained that Carteret County currently uses this model. Ms. Hodges noted that several program forms currently being used would simply need to be amended, as would several policy manuals.
- The County Manager was recently advised that the Camden Cooperative Extension full-time director had submitted his letter of resignation and that an interim extension director would be announced who would split time between two

area Cooperative Extension Offices. The County Manager is concerned that the lack of a full time extension director will place an additional burden on an already small Camden County Center staff and that existing 4-H Program services could be impacted if the staff (4-H Family Consumer Science Agent) were tasked with managing both the JCPC and 4-H programs.

Commissioner Duckwall made a motion to approve the moving of Camden's JCPC program from Cooperative Extension to the Sheriff's Department. At 9:11pm, the motion passed 5-0 with Chairman Garry Meiggs, Vice Chairman Michael McLain, and Commissioners Sandra Duckwall, Clayton Riggs, and Randy Krainiak, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; and no Commissioner not voting.
