Public Works Director Notes/Comments: Ten work orders have been reviewed for accuracy.

Treated gallons at the R/O WTP in January, 11,364,260

Average daily water use 366589 gallons/ Current treatment capacity 720000 gallons per day.

South Camden fire hydrants were flushed and checked for proper operation in 2017.

South Camden fire hydrants will be flow tested in the next two years, 2018 and 2019, to be ready for the department's next inspection in 2020.

The treated wastewater lagoon liner, on McPherson Road, has a tear about 135 feet long. The tear was discovered after the last snow storm. We think the ice and heavy winds caused the tear. Staff is working with Anlauf Engineering to discuss repair options and will have Joe Anlauf at the April Commissioners Meeting to explain the repair options. Staff has installed sheet plastic and Geo fabric to stabilize the berm from further damage.

The Noblet High School property was bush hogged in Mid-December, 42.5 ac. at a cost of \$4600.
