




Medicaid Transformation Tailored Plan:

Item Title: Application for Zoning Map Amendment from Waverly Sawyer

Summary:

Waverly Sawyer has requested a zoning map amendment for approximately 10 acres from the Highway Commercial (HC) Zoning District to the Neighborhood Residential (NR) Zoning District. The 10 acres consist of an approximately 1-acre parcel at 872 NC Hwy 343 N and approximately 9 acres from an adjoining parcel to the north west. Both parcels are located in South Mills Township.

The proposed zoning change is inconsistent with the CAMA Future Land Use Map. The CAMA Future Land Use Maps has the majority of property identified as Low Density Residential.

The proposed zoning change is inconsistent with the County's Comprehensive Future Land Use Map which identifies the parcels as Rural Preservation.

The neighborhood meeting was held on April 12, 2022. On July 20, 2022, the Planning Board unanimously recommended denial of the rezoning request.

Recommendations:

Motion to approve Consistency Statement:

The requested zoning change is inconsistent with Comprehensive Future Land Use Maps which identifies the property as Rural Preservation, residential use with a maximum density of one dwelling unit per 5 acres. The requested zoning change is inconsistent with the CAMA Future Land Use Plan which identifies the majority of the property as Low Density Residential (on lots 1 acre or greater).

Motion for denial:

Motion for denial of the Ordinance 2022-08-01/Rezoning Application (UDO 2022-06-09) for the two parcels of property, approximately 10 acres from Highway Commercial (HC) to Neighborhood Residential (NR).

Reasonableness Statement for denial:

The requested zoning change is inconsistent with the CAMA Future Land Use Plan which identifies the majority of the property as Low Density Residential of 1-2 acres or greater and with the Comprehensive Future Land Use Plan which identifies the property as Rural Preservation residential lots of 5 acres and greater.

Request: Waverly Sawyer is requesting a Zoning Map Amendment per Article 151.2.3.30 of the Unified Development Ordinance for a total of 10 acres from Highway Commercial (HC) to Neighborhood Residential (NR) zoning district.

Location Description: The 10 acres consist of an approximately 1-acre parcel at 872 NC Hwy 343 N and approximately 9 acres from an adjoining parcel to the north west. The parcel ID for 872 Hwy 343 N is 01-8907-00-43-8620-0000. The parcel ID of the approximately 9-acre parcel is 01-8907-00-65-3412-0000. Both parcels are located in South Mills Township.

Rezoning from Highway Commercial Zoning District (151.3.6.5):

The Highway Commercial district is applied to lots along the County's major roadways (e.g., US 158, US 17, NC 34, and NC 343) and is intended for automobile-oriented commercial development as well as large floorplate commercial uses and uses that require or generate truck traffic. The district also accommodates agricultural and institutional uses as well as higher density residential uses with a special use permit. New development in the HC district is grouped and configured to ensure regular lateral vehicular and pedestrian access along major transportation routes as a means of establishing a well-connected transportation system. New development is configured to maintain high visual quality along the major roadway, or is fully screened from view. Sufficient spacing and screening is included along lot lines shared with adjacent residential zoning districts to ensure compatibility. New commercial and multi-family developments in the district are subject to the design standards in Article 151.5 Development Standards.

Rezoning to Neighborhood Residential Zoning District (151.3.5.5)

The Neighborhood Residential (NR) district serves as a transition district from the rural and suburban portions of the County to areas proximate to village centers and major commercial corridors. The district is intended to accommodate single-family detached homes in a neighborhood setting at moderate densities. Mobile and manufactured homes on individual lots, conservation subdivisions, and agricultural uses are limited in order to preserve the district's neighborhood character. Manufactured homes are not allowed on lots within 5,280 linear feet of a village center boundary. The district's 40,000-square-foot minimum lot area may be reduced when lots are within one mile of a designated village center boundary and served by public sewer. District regulations discourage uses that interfere with the development of residential neighborhoods or that are detrimental to the district's single-family detached neighborhood character.











Watershed Map







Floodplain Map




Drainage -It appears the property drains to Pasquotank River.




Comprehensive Future Land Use Map

The CAMA Land Use Plan was adopted by the Camden County Board of Commissioners on April 4, 2005. The proposed zoning change is inconsistent in that the CAMA Future Land Use Map has the property identified as Low Density Residential (on lots 1 acre or greater). Neighborhood Residential (NR) zoning permits a minimum lot area of 40,000 square feet, which is less than 1 acre.



Item Title: Text Amendments to Camden County, NC Code of Ordinances

Summary:

The attached proposed text amendments to the Camden County Ordinances is divided into three sections as follows:

Part 1: The first section is a text amendment to the Unified Development Ordinance 151.3.8 to comply with FEMA 2020 model Ordinance updates and continue the Community Rating System.

Part 2: The second section is a proposed text amendment to the Unified Development Ordinance Article 151.3.8.3 Stormwater Management Plan Requirements and Division 9 of the Stormwater Drainage Design Manual to provide updates on the drainage plan requirements in the Special Flood Hazard Area (AE Flood zone).

Part 3: The third section is a proposed Wastewater Text Amendment to update the Sewer Use Ordinance and the Unified Development Ordinance to comply with the Camden County Future Land Use Plans.

The Planning Board voted on July 20th unanimously to recommend approval.

Approve Ordinance 2022-08-02 Part 1 Special Flood Hazard Area Text Amendment to comply with the FEMA Community Rating System requirements.

The proposed text amendment provides mandatory updates to the floodplain management practices of Camden County to remain in compliance with the FEMA Community Rating System requirements. It is merely a legislative mandate to remain valid in the County's exercise of authority to set standards & specifications.

Approve Ordinance 2022-08-02 Part 2 Special Flood Hazard Area Text Amendment

The proposed text amendment for an additional design option in the AE Flood zone (100-year flood) provides clarity to stormwater management plan requirements.

Approved Ordinance 2022-08-02 Part 3 Wastewater Text Amendment

The proposed text amendment requiring sanitary sewer connection supports the County's growth Management Plan for sewer system development.

Ordinance No. 2022-08-02 An Ordinance Amending the Camden County Code of Ordinances Camden County, North Carolina

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS as follows:

Article I: Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 151 of the Camden County Code of Ordinances of Camden County, North Carolina, which was originally adopted by the County Commissioners on January 1, 1998, and subsequently revised February 4, 2019 and subsequently amended, and as otherwise incorporated into the Camden County Code.

Article II: Construction

For purposes of this Ordinance, Article III relates to substantive changes required by the new General Statute 162A-213 in which underlined words (underline) shall be considered as additions to existing Ordinance language and strikethrough words (strikethrough) shall be considered deletions to existing language. New language of proposed ordinance shall be shown in italics, underlined, and highlighted (italics).

Article III:

Part 1:

Amending Camden County Code of Ordinances, specifically Chapter 151 Article 3.8.3 Special Flood Hazard Area Overly as follows:

151.3.8.3.B. General Provisions

1. Lands to which this Subchapter Applies

This subchapter shall apply to all special flood hazard areas within the County.

2. Special Flood Hazard Area Identified

The Special Flood Hazard Areas are those identified under the Cooperating Technical State (CTS) Agreement between the State of North Carolina and FEMA in its FIS dated December 21, 2018, for Camden County and associated DFIRM panels, including any digital data developed as part of the Flood Insurance Study, which are adopted by reference and declared a part of this section, and all revisions thereto. Future revisions to the FIS and DFIRM panels that do not change flood hazard data within the jurisdictional authority of Camden County are also adopted by reference and declared a part of this section.

151.3.8.3.C.4.b Certification Requirements

b. An Elevation Certificate (FEMA Form 81-31, as amended) or Floodproofing Certificate (FEMA Form 81-65, as amended) is required after the reference level is completed. Within ten calendar days of establishment of the reference level elevation, or floodproofing, by whatever construction means, whichever is applicable, it shall be the duty of the permit holder to submit to the Floodplain Administrator a certification of the elevation of the reference level, or floodproofed elevation, whichever is applicable in relation to mean sea level. Elevation certification shall be prepared by or under the direct supervision of a registered land surveyor or professional engineer and certified by same. Floodproofing certification shall be prepared by or under the direct supervision of a professional engineer or architect and certified by same. Any work done within the ten-day calendar period and prior to submission of the certification shall be at the permit holder's risk. The Floodplain Administrator shall review the certificate data submitted. Deficiencies detected by such review shall be corrected by the permit holder immediately and prior to further progressive work being permitted to proceed. Failure to submit the certification or failure to make required corrections shall be cause to issue a stop-work order for the project. (Optional at the discretion of Building Inspector or Flood Administrator)

151. 3.8.3.C.4.f. Certification Exemptions

The following structures, if located within A, <u>AO, AH, or</u> AE or AI-30 zones, are exempt from the elevation/floodproofing certification requirements specified in divisions (1) and (2) below:

1. Recreational vehicles meeting requirements of Section 3.8.3.D.2, Specific Standards;

- 2. Temporary structures meeting requirements of Section 3.8.3.D.2, Specific Standards; and
- 3. Accessory structures less than 150 600 square feet or less meeting requirements of Section 3.8.3.D.2.h. Accessory Structures, Specific Standards.

151.3.8.3.D.2.h Accessory Structures. When accessory structures (sheds, detached garages, etc.) are to be placed within a Special Flood Hazard Area, the following criteria shall be met:

- 1. Accessory structures shall not be used for human habitation (including work, sleeping, living, cooking or restroom areas) and shall not be temperature controlled:
- 2. Accessory structures shall be designed to have low flood damage potential;
- 3. Accessory structures shall be constructed and placed on the building site so as to offer the minimum resistance to the flow of floodwaters:
- 4. Accessory structures shall be firmly anchored in accordance with this subchapter or by bolting the building to a concrete slab or by over the top ties. When bolting to a concrete slab, one-half inch bolts six feet on center with a minimum of two per side shall be required. If over the top ties are used a minimum of two ties with a force adequate to secure the building is required; and 5. All service facilities such as electrical equipment shall be installed in accordance with
- Section 3.8.3.D.1.d; and
- 6. Openings to relieve hydrostatic pressure during a flood shall be provided below regulatory flood protection elevation in conformance with Section 3.8.3.D.2.d.43.
- 7. An accessory structure with a footprint less than 150 of 600 square feet or less in A, AO, AH, and AE Zones that satisfies the criteria outlined above does is not required to meet the elevation and floodproofing standards of Article 151.3, Section 3.8.3.C.2.b. an eElevation or floodproofing certifications are required for all other accessory structures in accordance with Article 151.3, Section 3.8.3.C.2.b.
- 8. Accessory structures over 150 square feet and up to 1,000 square feet or less with a value of less than \$15,000 may be permitted below the base flood elevation as defined in Section 10.3, Definitions, provided they satisfy the criteria outlined above.
- 9. Accessory structures greater than 1,000 square feet shall meet the elevation requirements as defined in Section 10.3, Definitions, or flood proofing requirements set forth in Section 3.8.3.C.2.c.

Part 2:

Amending Camden County Code of Ordinances, specifically Chapter 151 Article 151.3.8.3. Special Flood Hazard Area Overly and the Camden County Stormwater Drainage Design Manual Specifically Section 9 Floodplain and Floodway Management as follows:

151.3.8.3 Special Flood Hazard Area Overly

151.3.8.3.5 Duties and Responsibilities of the Floodplain Administrator

- o. Excavation and filling in the floodplain areas. Special Flood Hazard Areas, areas noted as AE in the FIRM maps, may be allowed at the approval of the county. Cut and fill for new development in the floodplain will enly may be acceptable if the net volume available within the floodplain remains the same (https://msc.fema.gov/portal/advanceSearch). The volumes will be judged from one-foot contour to the next. No credit will be provided for excavation below the normal water elevation of the creek or below the ground water table, whichever is higher. The Engineer will provide the areas and volumes at one-foot contour intervals for the existing conditions and demonstrate through volume calculations that the proposed condition equals or provides more storage volume for the development. The calculation and demonstration shall begin at the normal elevation, or invert elevation, and proceed by even one-foot increments to the FIRM reported base flood elevation for the immediate area. The cut and fill within the floodplain area must take place within the general confines of the development or within 500 feet of the river station shown on the FEMA maps.
- q. As an alternative to Item o of this Section, new developments which lie within a floodplain may fill beyond the balance limitations as provided by Item o if they subject their parcel and development to the Stormwater Management Plan Review process prescribed by Table 7.1.3 in this Ordinance and a Drainage Stormwater Study is performed in accordance with Division 7 of the County's Stormwater Drainage Design Manual. The Drainage Stormwater Study in this instance must show, the post development 100-year discharge rate is held to the pre-development discharge rate and that the hydraulic grade lines are not increased at any point immediately upstream or downstream of the development. This alternative will only be acceptable after a preapplication meeting with the County's Stormwater Engineer, County Planning Director or their designee, and the applicant or their design engineer and an appropriately scope of analysis is agreed to.

Division 9 Floodplain and Floodway Management

- 2. Excavation and filling in the floodplain areas, areas noted as AE in the FIRM maps, may be only be allowed with FEMA approval. Cut and fill for new development in the floodplain will only be acceptable if the net volume available with https://msc.fema.gov/portal/advanceSearch in the floodplain remains the same or based on methods discussed in Section 6. The volumes will be judged from one-foot contour to the next. No credit will be provided for excavation below the normal water elevation of the creek or below the ground water table, whichever is higher. The engineer will provide the areas and volumes at one-foot contour intervals for the existing conditions and demonstrate through volume calculations that the proposed condition equals or provides more storage volume for the development. The calculation and demonstration shall begin at the normal elevation, or invert elevation, and proceed by even one foot increments to the FIRM reported base flood elevation for the immediate area. The cut and fill within the floodplain area must take place within the general confines of the development or within 500' of the river station shown on the FEMA maps.
- 6. As an alternative to Item 2, new developments which lie within a floodplain may fill beyond the balance limitations as provided by Item 2 if they subject their parcel and development to the Stormwater Management Plan Review process prescribed by Table 7.1.3 in this Ordinance and a Drainage Stormwater Study is performed in accordance with Division 7 of this Manual. The Drainage Stormwater Study in this instance must show, the post development 100-year discharge rate is held to the pre-development discharge rate and that the hydraulic grade lines are not increased at any point immediately upstream or downstream of the development (within the boundaries of the parcels included in the development site). To use this alternative means of compliance, the applicant must hold a preapplication meeting with the County's Stormwater Engineer and County Planning Director and develop an approved scope of analysis.

Part 3:

Amending Camden County Code of Ordinances, specifically Chapter 151 Article 2.3.18, 2.3.20, 6.2.7, 6.5.2 and Chapter 52.015 as follows:

151.2.18 Minor Subdivision

B. Applicability

- 1. Subdivisions of land that include up to five lots (including the residual parcel) (see Figure 2.3.18.B: Minor Subdivision) shall be reviewed in accordance with the standards in this section.
- All lots that are adjacent to an existing public water supply line <u>and/or wastewater system</u> lines prior to approval of a minor subdivision shall connect to the public systems as part of the establishment of the minor subdivision. However, connection to the public water systems for one or more lots shall not require the subdivision to be reviewed as a preliminary plat.

C. Minor Subdivision Procedure

6. Minor Subdivision Review Standards

- a. A minor subdivision shall be approved if the application complies with the following:
 - 8. All lots (including the parent parcel) bordering an existing public water supply system water line and/or wastewater system sewer line shall connect to the public water supply system as part of the minor subdivision:
- b. Minor subdivisions of land located within the special flood hazard area shall comply with the standards in Section3.8.3 Special Flood Hazard Area Overlay (SFHA), and include the following statement: "Use of land within a floodplain or a special flood hazard area is substantially restricted by Camden County."
- c. If the minor subdivision is required to provide a connection to a public water supply system and/or
 wastewater.system, the plat shall include the following statement:
 - "The developer is required to install all wastewater and/or water lines and related improvements."

151.2.3.20 Preliminary Plat

3. If the preliminary plat is required to provide a connection to a public water supply system and wastewater system, the plat shall include the following statement:

"The developer is required to install all <u>wastewater and</u> water lines and related improvements."

151.6.2 Required Infrastructure

151.6.2.2 Generally

151.6.2.2.3. Sanitary Sewage System

- a. In cases of When development being is required to be served by a public or central private sewage systems, the subdivider or developer shall install all sewer lines in accordance with the standards in this Ordinance, the procedures manual, and other State or federal requirements.
- b. Sanitary sewage lines, including pump stations and treatment facilities shall be dedicated to the County for maintenance and operation. Sewer lines serving individual lots or uses prior to their connection to the central collection system shall not be the responsibility of the County.

151.6.5. Conservation Subdivision

6.5.2 Applicability

3. Where Prohibited

- a. The conservation subdivision option is not available for use in the NR, VR, or MX districts.
- b. <u>Suburban Residential Zoning District will not have individual septic systems due to the</u>
 <u>decrease in the Dimensional Requirements specifically the Minimum Lot Area, from 1 acre</u>
 to 0.5 acre.

Chapter 52 Sewer Use

USE OF PUBLIC SEWERS § 52.015 REQUIREMENT OF SEWER USE.

- (A) When the owner of a property, with access to public sanitary sewer, under District jurisdiction, including an owner of a non-district sewer system, is informed by the Albemarle Regional Health Services (ARHS) that the wastewater system serving the property is deemed non-repairable, such wastewater shall be discharged into a public sanitary sewer, subject to the provisions of § 52.125. The owner shall install at his expense a suitable building sewer or collecting sewer, as applicable, and shall install any other facilities necessary to connect the building sewer or collecting sewer to the public sewer at an access point provided by the district. The owner of real property shall, within six months of date of notification, make application and connection to the public sanitary sewer in accordance with the provisions of this section and §§ 52.105 through 52.112 off this chapter.
- (B) Whenever a building sewer or collecting sewer connected to the public sanitary sewer becomes clogged, broken, out of order or detrimental to the use of the public sewer, the owner having charge of any building or premises through which the building sewer or collecting sewer collects wastewater shall, upon notification by the Board, reconstruct, alter, clean or repair the building sewer or collecting sewer as the condition of such may require within ten days after receiving notification.

(C) New construction, either subdivision or single lot, residential or commercial, with access to public sanitary sewer system under District jurisdiction, shall be required to connect their sanitary wastewater drain to the system and such wastewater shall be discharged into a public sanitary sewer, subject to the provisions of § 52.125. The owner shall install at his expense a suitable building sewer or collecting sewer, as applicable, and shall install any other facilities necessary to connect the building sewer or collecting sewer to the public sewer at an access point provided by the district. The owner of real property shall make application and connection to the public sanitary sewer in accordance with the provisions of this section and §§ 52.105 through 52.112 of this chapter.

SUMMARY:

It has come to the attention of County leadership that the property located on RT 343 N that has been designated for the new high school is less than desirable to develop due to the subsoils located on the property. After much work and various soil samplings the Manager at Risk, MB Kahn, has determined the cost to mitigate the site would drive the cost up significantly upwards of \$4M. In addition, the location of the school along RT 343 N will create traffic issues for both the traveling public and those using the school location.

With that in mind, the County wanted to look for an alternate site for the new high school. The location being considered is located across from the County Administration Building on Hwy 158 East. This project site is located along the south side of NC Hwy 158 (Shortcut Road) in Camden, North Carolina. More specifically, the site is located approximately 0.5-miles east of the NC Hwy 158 and NC SR 34 intersection and was observed to consist of an open agricultural area. The property consists of 194 acres of which 60-70 acres would be designated for the new high school. This property will provide adequate space for the new building, parking, sports fields and expansion when needed.

The County has already contracted with Timmons Group to conduct an environmental analysis and soil borings on this site to ensure the land is satisfactory for the new high school (see attached).

The Public Hearing was held on June 6, 2022 and a joint meeting was held with the Board of Education on July 27, 2022.

PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), made and entered into as of the _____ day of ____ , 20___ ("Effective Date"), by and between WILLIAMS FARMS OF NORTH CAROLINA, INC., a North Carolina corporation ("Seller"), and THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NORTH CAROLINA, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina ("Buyer"), provides as follows:

Recitals:

- A. Seller is the owner of a certain parcel of undeveloped land located on the south side of U.S. Route 158 in Camden County, North Carolina, containing approximately 195 acres (the "Entire Parcel") as shown on the **Exhibit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- B. Seller has agreed to sell to Buyer, and Buyer has agreed to buy from Seller a portion of the Entire Parcel containing approximately seventy (70) acres (the "Property") and to grant Buyer an option to purchase the remainder of the Entire Parcel (the "Option Property").

Agreement:

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged and which includes the mutual promises of the parties, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **Property**. Seller agrees to sell the Property to Buyer, and Buyer agrees to purchase the Property from Seller. The Property includes all strips, gores, easements, privileges, rights-of-way, riparian and other water rights, rights to lands underlying any adjacent streets or roads, and other tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances, if any, pertaining to or accruing to the benefit of the Property.
- 2. **Purchase Price**. The purchase price ("<u>Purchase Price</u>") for the Property is Twenty Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$25,000.00) per acre of land (rounded to the nearest thousandth of an acre) in the Property as determined by the "Survey" (defined below). The Purchase Price shall be payable as follows:
- (a). \$25,000 by the "Deposit," as defined in Section 4 below, which shall be applied to the Purchase Price at the Closing; and
- (b). The balance shall be payable to Seller in immediately available funds at the Closing; and
- 3. *Closing*. The purchase of the Property will be closed ("<u>Closing</u>") on or before thirty (30) days after the last day of the "Investigation Period" (defined below). The Closing will be held at 10:00 A.M. local time in the offices of Buyer's attorney, unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties.
- 4. *Earnest Money Deposit*. On the first business day following the Effective Date, Buyer shall make an earnest money deposit in the amount of Twenty Five Thousand and 00/100

Dollars (\$25,000.00) (the "<u>Deposit</u>"), to be held in escrow by _____ ("<u>Escrow Agent</u>"). If Buyer does not timely make the Deposit, then Seller may immediately terminate this Agreement by written notice to Buyer. The Deposit shall be subject to the terms set forth below:

- 4.1. Escrow Agent shall hold the Deposit in an interest bearing FDIC or FSLIC insured account. Interest shall be added to the Deposit and shall be considered to be a part of the Deposit.
- 4.2. The Escrow Agent shall disburse the Deposit in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 4.3. If the Deposit has not been disbursed previously, and parties are proceeding to Closing, then the Escrow Agent shall deliver the Deposit at Closing to the settlement agent, if other than the Escrow Agent, for credit against the Purchase Price.
- 5. *Investigation Period*. Through 5:00 P.M. local time on the 120th day after the Effective Date (the "<u>Investigation Period</u>"), Buyer and Buyer's representatives shall have access to the Entire Parcel for the purpose of conducting its due diligence investigations.
- 5.1. During the Investigation Period Buyer and Buyer's agents or designees shall have the right to enter the Entire Parcel for purposes of performing such investigations and other inquiries, tests and evaluations as Buyer deems reasonably necessary, including economic, legal and title analysis, securing environmental and engineering reports, determining the availability of suitable utilities, and performing such other reasonable and customary due diligence as the Buyer elects to perform. All such investigations shall be at Buyer's sole expense.
- 5.2. Within five (5) business days after the Effective Date, Seller shall deliver to Buyer, if not previously delivered, the following documents and information with respect to the Entire Parcel to the extent that they are in existence and are in Seller's possession or are readily available to Seller without any cost or expense to Seller:
 - 5.2.1. The most recent survey;
 - 5.2.2. Any soil reports or environmental assessments; and
 - 5.2.3. A copy of any policy of title insurance issued in favor of Seller.
- 5.3. Seller makes no independent representation or warranty as to such documents except that they are true and correct copies of the materials in Seller's possession. All materials delivered to Buyer pursuant to this Agreement shall be treated as confidential by Buyer and returned to Seller in the event that Buyer does not acquire the Property; provided, however, that Buyer shall have the right to disclose such materials to Buyer's agents, employees, attorneys, consultants, investors and lenders so long as reasonable efforts are made to keep such matters confidential.
- 5.4. Buyer may enter the Entire Parcel for the purpose of obtaining a phase I environmental site assessment of the Entire Parcel and for conducting soil and other geotechnical tests and evaluations, subject to the limitations set forth below. Buyer shall give Seller

reasonable notice prior to entering the Entire Parcel, and Seller shall have the right to observe the testing being done. Buyer shall fill in all holes and otherwise restore the Entire Parcel after conducting such tests.

- 5.5. Buyer shall not perform any invasive environmental testing (e.g. a phase II environmental site assessment) without the prior written approval of Seller.
- 5.6. Buyer shall repair any damage to the Entire Parcel caused by its investigations. Buyer agrees to indemnify and to hold Seller harmless from any loss, cost, expense or liability incurred or sustained by the claim of any person made by reason of any due diligence activities conducted by Buyer or its agents or contractors. This indemnity shall survive Closing and any termination of this Agreement.
- 5.7. Buyer shall have the absolute right at any time prior to the expiration of the Investigation Period (as the same may be extended) to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to Seller, and upon such termination the entire Deposit (together with any interest but less any Escrow Agent fees) shall be paid to the Buyer, and the parties shall have no further rights, obligations or liabilities with respect to each other under this Agreement (except for Buyer's indemnity obligations that survive termination of this Agreement).
- 5.8. Upon Seller's request, Buyer will provide Seller with copies of all reports and other due diligence materials with respect to the Entire Parcel.
- 6. Subdivision Plat. Promptly following the execution and delivery of this Agreement, Buyer shall cause a surveyor licensed in the State of North Carolina to prepare a subdivision plat (the "Subdivision Plat") and other documents required to create the Property as a separately subdivided parcel of land. The acreage of the Property, as shown on the Subdivision Plat (rounded to the nearest one thousandth of an acre), shall, absent manifest error, be the basis for determining the Purchase Price. Seller shall have the right to approve the configuration and dimensions of the Property as shown on the Subdivision Plat, which approval shall not be unreasonable delayed, withheld, or conditioned. Buyer shall cause the Subdivision Plat to be approved by any applicable administrative or political process and cause it to be recorded in the office of the Camden County Register of Deeds. Seller agrees to cooperate with Buyer in the process to have the Subdivision Plat recorded and shall sign the Subdivision Plat as the landowner if required as a condition to the approval or recordation of the Subdivision Plat. Seller shall not be obligated to approve or sign any Subdivision Plat that provides for the dedication of any land without compensation deemed acceptable to Seller.
- 7. *Title and Survey*. Seller will convey title to the Property to Seller by Special Warranty Deed, the form of which is attached as <u>Exhibit B</u>.
- 7.1. On or before twenty days prior to the end of the Investigation Period, Buyer shall at its sole cost and expense cause a title examination to be made of the Property and shall obtain a commitment for the issuance of title insurance (the "Commitment") by a title insurance company acceptable to Buyer (the "<u>Title Company</u>"). The Title Company need not be the same company as the Escrow Agent, but can be any title insurance company selected by Buyer. A copy of the Commitment shall be delivered to Seller.

- 7.2. On or before twenty days prior to the end of the Investigation Period, Buyer shall obtain, at its sole cost and expense, a survey of the Property prepared and certified by a North Carolina licensed surveyor ("Survey"). At least two prints of the Survey shall be delivered to Seller.
- 7.3. Buyer shall have until twenty days prior to the end of the Investigation Period to examine the Commitment and the Survey.
- 7.3.1. If Buyer finds any objectionable matters in the Commitment or on the Survey (each an "Objectionable Condition"), then Buyer shall notify Seller in writing of all of such Objectionable Conditions on or before the end of the Investigation Period ("Buyer's Notice"). Copies of all documents evidencing each Objectionable Condition will be delivered with the Buyer's Notice. Buyer's failure to timely give the Buyer's Notice shall be deemed Buyer's acceptance of the condition of the title to the Property "as is", including all matters shown on the Commitment and Survey.
- 7.3.2. Within fifteen (15) days after receipt of Buyer's Notice, Seller shall notify Buyer in writing whether Seller elects to cure any of the Objectionable Conditions ("Seller's Notice"). Seller's failure to timely give the Seller's Notice shall be deemed Seller's election not to cure any of the Objectionable Conditions.
- 7.3.3. If Seller elects not to cure any one or more of the Objectionable Conditions, then Buyer may, prior to the expiration of the Investigation Period, terminate this Agreement and receive a refund of the Deposit. If Buyer does not terminate the Agreement, then Byer shall be deemed to have waived the Objectionable Conditions that Seller has not elected to cure and they shall be Permitted Exceptions.
 - 7.3.4. The following shall constitute "Permitted Exceptions":
- 7.3.4.1. All exceptions shown the Commitment that are not Objectionable Conditions enumerated in a Buyer's Notice.
- 7.3.4.2. All Objectionable Conditions enumerated in a Buyer's Notice and with respect to which Buyer has waived its objection or is deemed to have waived its objection.
- 7.3.4.3. All matters of record as of the Effective Date and all matters of survey that would be disclosed by an accurate survey of the Property and that are not objected to by Buyer or that are objected to by Buyer and with respect to which Buyer has waived its objection or is deemed to have waived its objection.
- 7.3.5. In all events, Seller shall (x) cause to be discharged at Closing the lien of all instruments securing financing obtained by Seller and (y) execute an affidavit confirming that (a) there are no rights of possession (other than ______) and (b) no mechanics' liens or materialmen's liens or claims have been or may be filed against the Property or, if Seller cannot provide such confirmation, Seller shall cause the Title Company to insure Buyer's title without any exception for mechanics' and materialmen's liens.

- 7.4. If Seller elects to cure any Objectionable Conditions, then Seller shall cure such Objectionable Conditions at or prior to Closing. If Seller elects to cure, but shall fail to cure, any Objectionable Condition at or prior to Closing, then Buyer may either (a) cure such condition itself if the Objectionable Condition is a lien or encumbrance of an ascertainable amount which can be cured by the payment of money, and deduct from the Purchase Price the reasonable costs and expenses incurred by Buyer in curing such Objectionable Condition, (b) waive the Objectionable Condition and proceed to Close the transaction contemplated by this Agreement with no reduction in the Purchase Price relating to the uncured Objectionable Condition (except to the extent of liens or encumbrances of an ascertainable amount), or (c) terminate this Agreement in which case the Escrow Agent shall return the Deposit to Buyer.
- 7.5. Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement, Seller will permit no changes to the status of the title to the Property after the Effective Date that would be binding on Buyer without the consent of the Buyer.

8. Closing Costs; Settlement Adjustments.

- 8.1. Seller shall pay any North Carolina transfer tax with respect to the transfer of title to the Property.
- 8.2. Buyer shall be responsible for the payment of the title insurance premiums, its attorneys' fees, and the cost of recording the title instruments and the Deed of Trust, and the fees of Seller's attorney to prepare the Note and Deed of Trust.
- 8.3. Seller shall be responsible for all delinquent, deferred or "roll back" real estate property taxes applicable to the Property, including any interest or penalties. All other current year real estate property taxes for the Property shall be prorated as of the date of Closing on a calendar year basis. In the event the taxes for the year of Closing are unknown, the tax proration will be based upon such taxes for the prior year and, at the request of either party, the taxes shall be re-prorated and adjusted when the tax bill for the year of Closing is received and the actual amount of taxes is known.
- 8.4. Seller shall be responsible for all governmental assessments confirmed as of the Closing, and Buyer shall be responsible for any such assessments or dues confirmed thereafter.
- 9. *Seller's Representations and Warranties*. Seller represents and warrants to Buyer that as of the Effective Date:
- 9.1. This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Seller, constitutes the valid and binding obligation of the Seller, and is enforceable against the Seller in accordance with its terms.
- 9.2. To the best of Seller's knowledge, there are no pending, threatened or contemplated condemnation actions involving all or any portion of the Entire Parcel, and Seller has received no notice of any such action.

- 9.3. Seller has received no notice of and to the best of Seller's knowledge there is no pending litigation involving Seller or the Property which would in any way (i) be binding upon the Buyer and materially and adversely limit the Buyer's full use and enjoyment of the Entire Parcel, or (ii) limit or restrict Seller's right or ability to enter into this Agreement and consummate the transactions contemplated under this Agreement.
- 9.4. Seller is duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, with full power and authority to enter into the transactions set forth in this Agreement. Upon request by Buyer, Seller shall supply to Buyer a true and complete copy of resolutions or organizational documents as shall be reasonably necessary to provide evidence that Seller is properly organized and that Seller's constituent officers or partners are authorized to execute all the documents contemplated by this Agreement.
- 9.5. To the best of Seller's knowledge, without independent investigation or inquiry, and except to the extent otherwise disclosed in any environmental report or study obtained by Buyer prior to Closing or in any environmental report or study delivered by Seller to Buyer prior to Closing: (a) Seller has not received written notice from any governmental authority relating to an existing violation of the Entire Parcel under any applicable environmental law; and (b) Seller has not caused, during the period of Seller's ownership of the Entire Parcel, any discharge of hazardous materials on or from the Entire Parcel in violation of any applicable environmental law.
- 9.5.1. The term "applicable environmental law" means any law, statute, code, rule, or regulation of the United States, the State of North Carolina, and all local governmental or regulatory authorities exercising jurisdiction over Seller or the Entire Parcel, pertaining to prohibition or regulation of hazardous or toxic wastes or materials, including, but not limited to, the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) and the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) (42 U.S.C. Section 9601, et seq.), as amended from time to time.
- 9.5.2. Buyer acknowledges that current or future federal, state and local laws and regulations may require the cleanup of any matters subsequently discovered on the Entire Parcel, which constitute hazardous, toxic or regulated materials, wastes or substances under applicable environmental laws at the expense of the persons who, in the past, present or future may have had or continue to have an interest in the Entire Parcel including, without limited to, current, past and future owners and users/operators including tenants of the Entire Parcel. The cost and expense of such cleanup may be substantial. Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Buyer shall look solely to the experts and professionals selected or approved by Buyer to advise Buyer with respect to the condition of the Entire Parcel and will not hold Seller or any brokers responsible for any environmental conditions or problems relating to the Entire Parcel or for any remediation or other cleanup activities in connection therewith, and hereby releases Seller from any such liability.
- 9.6. Seller is not a "foreign person" within the meaning of Section 1445 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended.

- 10. **Buyer's Representations and Warranties**. Buyer represents and warrants to Seller that as of the Effective Date:
- 10.1. This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Buyer, constitutes the valid and binding obligation of the Buyer, and is enforceable against the Buyer in accordance with its terms.
- 10.2. Buyer is duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the place of its formation with full power and authority to enter into the transactions set forth in this Agreement. Buyer shall provide at Closing an opinion of counsel in form and substance satisfactory to Seller that Buyer has duly authorized the execution and delivery of this Agreement and the purchase of the Property and that the person who has executed and delivered on behalf of Buyer, the Note, Deed of Trust and all other documents with respect to the transaction contemplated by this Agreement is duly authorized to do so.

11. Conditions to Closing.

- 11.1. The obligations of the Buyer to close on its acquisition of the Property are subject to the satisfaction at or prior to Closing of the following conditions and upon each of the factual statements set forth below being true:
- 11.1.1. The Seller shall have performed and complied with all terms and conditions required by this Agreement to be performed or complied with by the Seller prior to or at Closing.
- 11.1.2. The representations and warranties of Seller contained in this Agreement shall be true and correct on the date of Closing.
- 11.1.3. There shall be no encumbrances or other defects in the title to the Property other than the Permitted Exceptions.
 - 11.1.4. The Subdivision Plat shall have been recorded.
- 11.2. The obligations of the Seller hereunder are subject to the satisfaction at or prior to Closing of the following conditions and upon each of the factual statements set forth below being true:
- 11.2.1. The Buyer shall have performed and complied with all terms and conditions required by this Agreement to be performed or complied with by the Buyer prior to or at Closing.
- 11.2.2. The representations and warranties of Buyer contained in this Agreement shall be true and correct on the date of Closing.
 - 11.2.3. The Subdivision Plat shall have been recorded.

- 12. **Seller's Obligations at Closing**. Seller shall deliver to Buyer the following at Closing:
- 12.1. An executed counterpart of a settlement statement showing the Purchase Price and all credits, allocations, prorations and other financial adjustments between the parties as set forth in this Agreement ("Settlement Statement").
- 12.2. The executed and acknowledged Special Warranty Deed to the Property, with a legal description of the Property based on the Survey or recorded Plat.
- 12.3. A duly executed lien affidavit sufficient to permit the Title Company to issue its title policy without exception for unpaid laborers' and materialmen's liens and without exception for rights of possession of any third party other than _______.
- 12.4. A certificate given under penalty of perjury and on a form approved under regulations promulgated under Section 1445 of Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, that Seller is not a foreign person.
- 12.5. Such other documents and instruments which may be necessary for the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement as may be reasonably requested by Buyer or Buyer's counsel.
- 13. *Buyer's Obligations at Closing*. Buyer shall deliver the following to the Seller at Closing:
 - 13.1. An executed counterpart of the Settlement Statement.
- 13.2. The Purchase Price, subject to credits, allocations, prorations and adjustments as set forth in this Agreement, and minus the original principal amount of the Note to be paid by wire transfer or other immediately available funds in sufficient time to permit Seller to discharge any deeds of trust or other monetary liens against the Property on a "same day" basis.
- 13.3. Such other documents and instruments which may be necessary for the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement as may be reasonably requested by Seller or Seller's counsel.
- 14. *Risk of Loss*. Risk of loss prior to Closing shall be on Seller and Seller shall provide notice to Buyer promptly after the occurrence of any loss of or damage to the Property.
- 15. **Eminent Domain**. If, prior to Closing, more than five percent (5%) of the Property is taken by eminent domain, or if such condemnation proceedings are commenced, Buyer shall have the option, by written notice to Seller, to terminate this Agreement. If Buyer does not elect to terminate this Agreement then (i) this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, (ii) Seller shall assign, transfer and set over to Buyer at the Closing all of Seller's right, title and interest in and to the eminent domain proceedings and any awards that may be made for such taking (including any funds which Seller may have received for such condemnation prior to

Closing), and (iii) after Closing, Buyer shall be solely responsible, at its cost, for litigating any eminent domain proceedings that have not been completed prior to Closing.

16. **Brokerage Commissions**. Seller and Buyer represent and warrant each to the other that they have not dealt with any broker or realtor in connection with this transaction. Each party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other from and against any and all claims, demands or the cost and expense thereof (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any brokerage commission, fee or other compensation due or alleged to be due to any person in connection with the transaction contemplated by this Agreement based upon any agreement alleged to have been made or other action alleged to have been taken by the indemnifying party. This indemnity obligation shall survive Closing and any termination of this Agreement.

17. Default and Remedies.

- 17.1. If Seller fails to perform any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement or is otherwise in default under this Agreement, then Buyer, at Buyer's sole option and as its sole remedies, may elect to:
 - 17.1.1. Waive the default or failure and close "as is"; or
- 17.1.2. Terminate this Agreement by written notice to Seller given on or before the date of Closing, in which event Buyer shall be entitled to recover the Deposit, in which case both parties shall be released from all further obligations under this Agreement except for those obligations that specifically survive termination of this Agreement; or
- 17.1.3. Seek specific performance of Seller's obligations under this Agreement provided that any suit for specific performance must be filed within ninety (90) days after the date on which Seller's default is alleged to have occurred or it shall be forever barred.
- 17.2. If Buyer fails to perform any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement or is otherwise in default under this Agreement, then Seller, as its sole remedy, shall receive the Deposit as agreed and liquidated damages for the breach, whereupon the parties shall be relieved of all further obligations under this Agreement except for Buyer's indemnity obligations which survive termination of this Agreement.
- 17.3. If either party is in breach of its representations or warranties, and such breach is not disclosed by the breaching party to the other party in writing prior to Closing, then the other party shall have whatever rights or remedies are available against the breaching party at law or equity. Notwithstanding the foregoing to the contrary neither party may bring a claim of breach of representation or warranty by the other unless the party claiming the breach notifies the other party of its claims within one (1) year after the Closing.
- 17.4. In no event shall either party be liable to the other party for consequential or punitive damages.
- 17.5. In the event either party brings any legal action to enforce its rights against the other party, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party all legal costs (including reasonable attorneys fees at all tribunal levels).

18. **Assignment**. Neither party shall assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other; provided that, Buyer may assign its right to take title under this Agreement to another entity owned or controlled by Buyer or the principal owners of Buyer, but Buyer shall not be relieved of its obligations under this Agreement.

19. *Miscellaneous*.

TO BUYER:

- 19.1. Property Transferred "As Is and Where Is". Subject to the Seller's representations and warranties specifically set forth in this Agreement and in the special warranty deed to be delivered at Closing: (i) it is understood and agreed that Seller has not made and is not making and specifically disclaims any warranties, representations or guarantees of any kind or character, express or implied, oral or written, past, present or future, with respect to the Property and its suitability for any particular purpose or use; (ii) Buyer acknowledges that it is generally familiar with the Property and is a sophisticated Buyer of real estate, and that it is relying upon its own expertise and that of its consultants in purchasing the Property and that it will conduct such inspections and investigations as it deems necessary including, but not limited to, the physical and environmental conditions thereof and shall rely upon the same; and (iii) Seller shall sell and convey to Buyer, and Buyer shall accept the Property, "AS IS, WHERE IS, WITH ALL FAULTS". The terms and conditions of this provision shall expressly survive the Closing and not merge with the provisions of any closing documents, shall run with the land and shall be binding on any successors, assigns or transferees of Buyer. Neither Seller nor Buyer is liable or bound in any manner by any oral or written statements, representations or information pertaining to the Property furnished by any broker, agent, employee, servant or other person, unless the same are expressly set forth herein.
- 19.2. <u>Notices</u>. All notices under this Agreement shall be given in writing and shall be: (a) hand delivered against a written receipt of delivery, (b) delivered to a nationally recognized overnight courier service for next business day delivery with delivery changes paid by, or billed to, the Sender, or (c) by email, provided, however, that if such notice is given by email, an original counterpart of such communication shall concurrently be sent in either the manner specified in the <u>clause (b)</u> above. Each such notice, demand or request, shall be deemed to have been given upon the earlier of (i) actual receipt or refusal by the addressee or (ii) one day after the deposit thereof with a courier if sent pursuant to <u>clause (b)</u> above. Notices shall be directed as follows:

Notices may be given on behalf of any party by its legal counsel. Either party may, from time to time, by notice as herein provided, designate a different address to which notice to it shall be sent.

- 19.3. <u>Knowledge</u>. The phrases "to the best of Seller's knowledge," "to Seller's knowledge," "to Seller's actual knowledge," "Seller has no knowledge of," and similar phrases shall mean the actual, and not constructive, current knowledge of Frank T. Williams; and shall not impose any requirement upon such individual to undertake any independent investigation or inquiry.
- 19.4. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina.
- 19.5. Entire Agreement. This instrument and any exhibits and addenda hereto contain the entire understanding and agreement by and between the parties and all prior or contemporaneous oral or written agreements or instruments are merged herein and no amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless the same is in writing and signed by the parties hereto. There are no representations, warranties or undertakings given or made by either party hereto except as set forth herein or in any instrument delivered pursuant hereto.
- 19.6. <u>Survival</u>. The indemnity obligations of the parties set forth in this Agreement shall survive termination of this Agreement and Closing. The representations and warranties of the parties shall survive for a period of one (1) year after Closing. All obligations of the parties which are required to be performed by a party after Closing under the terms of this Agreement, including all obligations regarding the Development Obligations, shall survive closing.

- 19.7. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective permitted successors and assigns.
- 19.8. <u>Captions and Headings</u>. The captions and headings throughout this Agreement are for convenience and reference only and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to define or add to the interpretation, construction or meaning of any provision of this Agreement.

The term "business day" shall mean any day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or a day in which the North Carolina courts or federal banks are closed. When any date for taking action does not fall on a business day, then the time for taking such action will be extended to the next business day. Time is of the essence with respect to the rights and obligations created under this Agreement.

20. *Option*

- 20.1. If Buyer closes on the acquisition of the Property then Buyer shall have the exclusive option (the "Option") to purchase the Option Property. The term during which the Option may be exercised by Buyer shall be three (3) years, beginning on the date of the Closing on Buyer's purchase of the Property and ending on the date which is the third anniversary of the Closing on Buyer's purchase of the Property(the "Option Period"). Each Option Parcel must have a length that extends from the frontage on Short Cut Road to the rear boundary of the Entire Parcel and be of generally uniform width.
- 20.3. The purchase price of each Option Parcel shall be in the amount of \$25,000 per acre for any Option Parcel the Option Notice for which is given prior to the first anniversary of the Closing on the Property, \$26,500 per acre for any Option Parcel the Option Notice for which is given prior to the second anniversary of the Closing on the Property, and \$28,090 per acre for any Option Parcel the Option Notice for which is given on or after the second anniversary of the Closing on the Property.
- 20.4. If Buyer timely exercises the Option with respect to any Option Parcel, then a contract for the sale and purchase of such Option Parcel shall exist between Seller and Buyer on the same terms and conditions as the sale and purchase of the Property except that (a)

there shall be no additional Inspection Period with respect to any Option Parcel (Buyer shall be satisfied with all aspects of each Option Parcel prior to its giving an Option Notice), (b) Buyer shall give Seller notice of any Objectionable Condition as to matters of title or survey at the time of giving the Option Notice, (c) the Closing shall occur within fifteen (15) days after the recordation of a subdivision plat creating the Option Parcel as a separate parcel, and (d) Buyer shall make an earnest money deposit in the amount of \$25,000 with respect to each Option Parcel within three (3) business days after it delivers the Option Notice with respect to such Option Parcel. Buyer shall have the obligation to cause to be prepared and recorded a subdivision plat for each Option Parcel and Seller shall have the approval right as set forth in Section 5 above. In particular Seller's right to approve the configuration and dimensions of any Option Parcel shall include the access to each portion of the Entire Parcel that Buyer has not purchased.



MINUTES

A Regular Meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners was held on July 5, 2022 in the boardroom of the New Camden Public Library in Camden, North Carolina.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ross Munro at 7:00 PM. Also Present: Vice-Chair Tiffney White, Commissioners Tom White, Clayton Riggs and Randy Krainiak. Administration Staff Present: County Attorney John Morrison and Clerk to the Board Karen Davis.

INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Pastor Tommy Berry gave the invocation and the Board led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ITEM 1. CONSIDERATION OF AGENDA

The agenda was amended to add the following:

- Sarah Hill of the Dismal Swamp Welcome Center added to Presentations as Item 4.C.
- Vehicle Tax Refund added to the Consent Agenda as Item 8.M.

ITEM 2. CONFLICT OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE STATEMENT

Clerk to the Board Karen Davis read the Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement.

ITEM 3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Deborah Penwell of South Mills shared the following remarks:

I have some concerns about the new site after the June commissioner meeting. At the last meeting, it was stated that the whole parcel would be purchased and the property not used for the school would be used for "economic development" In today's current climate, I am very concerned that we would want to surround a school with businesses. Safety wise, I would think you would want to minimize the people around your school campus for the purpose of being able to identify who should and shouldn't be around your school. This would also go for the sports field, parking lots etc. Would there be a minimum distance required for people to build off of the school property? Would there be requirements of surveillance equipment to monitor what was going on at the businesses that may carry over to school property? What steps would be taken for the safety of our students?

There are also high voltage power lines running through this property. How far away from them will the buildings, fields, and parking lots be from these to negate any potential issues this may cause?

I also gathered some data from different locations in the county. From the new proposed site to the county line is only 1.5 miles. It is not a central location at all. In fact, it's only 10.8 miles from Currituck County High School.

The current site is only 2.2 miles from the middle school. The NEW proposed site is 6 miles from the middle school. This may not sound like a big deal, but our middle school and high school students share buses. This would affect the amount of money needed for fuel for buses as well as timing for the school with the schools further apart.

Another concern with the new site is that it is further away from the Sheriff's department, EMS, and fire station. In emergency situations, every minute counts and moving the site further away would increase response times.

My last major concern with the new proposed site is the traffic situation. On June 29th, I sat at the current site from 2:30–3:30 pm and tracked the traffic that went down 3/43. There were approximately 202 cars that went past during that time. On June 30th from 2:33–3:33 pm, I sat at the entrance to the old library and tracked the number of cars that passed the new proposed site. During that time 602 cars went past. I understand that some of that traffic may have been beach traffic, but there was a steady stream going both ways. Delivery trucks, work vehicles, semi trucks going both directions the entire time. If the new school is built at this location, I'm assuming well over 90% of the new student drivers, as well as buses will be turning left upon leaving the campus due to the location being so close to the county line.

I'm not saying that the current site is perfect, but there seem to be some large red flags with this new proposed site that go well beyond the soil prep needed to start construction. Brenda Elmore of Camden addressed the board in support of the new high school, including the ways in which a school building facility affects student learning with emphases on overcrowding and temporary trailers being used as classrooms. Ms. Elmore spoke in favor of using the current site on 343 as the site for the new high school.

Bill Stafford of South Mills addressed the board in regard to a proposed boat ramp in South Mills on property that currently belongs to the South Mills Water Association. Mr. Stafford also expressed concern that the South Camden Water and Sewer District will not sell additional water to South Mills Water Association but will sell water to the Association for use by developers and that the county will go to great lengths to send sewage to South Mills, but not water. Mr. Stafford requested that Vice-Chair Tiffney White and Chairman Ross Munro conduct a public forum in South Mills for the purpose of open dialogue with the citizens.

Representative Howard Hunter, 5th District House Member, introduced himself as he now represents Camden County in addition to Hertford, Gates, and Pasquotank Counties.

ITEM 4. PRESENTATIONS

A. Chairman Ross Munro introduced the new Camden County Manager, Mrs. Erin Burke. Mrs. Burke will begin her tenure on July 11, 2022.

The two amendments to the Schedule of Fees were presented as follows:

• Reduce the sewer tap fee to a flat rate of \$500 if the connection is done in a development in the course of installing piping for a new subdivision. The fees will remain the same if the county installs the connection.

The developer of a subdivision is required to install piping to handle the wastewater generated in the development. The proposal is to reduce the tap fee to a connection fee only to help offset the installer's cost of installation. Since the county is not providing any labor or materials there would be minimum impact. The county will benefit in the long run by the acquisition new customers and the developer will be incentivized to tie in to the county system. The capacity fee will remain the same. Staff recommends approval.

• Increase the base water rate by \$5 from \$25 to \$30 per month. Staff recommends that this amendment be considered in the FY 2023-2024 Budget as part of an overall water usage rate increase.

Public Comments

Bill Stafford of South Mills spoke in opposition to the proposed sewer tap fee reduction. Mr. Stafford explained reducing the tap fee will cost the county revenue dollars and developers should be treated just like any other business.

Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults

Agreement for the Provision of County-Based Aging Services

This Agreement, entered into as of this 1st day of July, 2022, by and between the County of **Camden** (hereinafter referred to as the "County") and the **Albemarle Commission** Area Agency on Aging, (hereinafter referred to as the "Area Agency").

Witnesseth That:

WHEREAS, the Area Agency and the County agree to the terms and conditions for provision of aging services in connection with activities financed in part by Older Americans Act grant funds, provided to the Area Agency from the United States Department of Health and Human Services through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) and state appropriations made available to the Area Agency through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, as set forth in a) this document, b) the County Funding Plan, as reviewed by the Area Agency and the Division of Aging and Adult Services, c) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, d) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, Volumes I through IV, and, e) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Community Service Providers Monitoring Guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, and mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. As provided in the Area Plan, community service providers specified by the County to encourage maximum collocation and coordination of services for older persons are as follows:

 Albemarle Commission Inter County Public Transportation Authority Quality Home Staffing, Inc
- 1(a) The Community Service Provider(s), shall be those specified in the County Funding Plan on the Provider Services Summary format(s) (DAAS-732) for the period ending June 30 for the year stated above.
- 2. <u>Availability of Funds</u>. The terms set forth in this Agreement for payment are contingent upon the receipt of Home and Community Care Block Grant funding by the Area Agency.
- 3. Grant Administration. The grant administrator for the Area Agency shall be Laura Alvarico,

Area Agency Director. The grant administrator for the County shall be **Erin Burke**, **County Manager**.

It is understood and agreed that the grant administrator for the County shall represent the County in the performance of this Agreement. The County shall notify the Area Agency in writing if the administrator changes during the grant period. Specific responsibilities of the grant administrator for the County are provided in paragraph seven (7) of this Agreement.

- 4. Services authorized through the County Funding Plan, as specified on the <u>Provider Services Summary</u> format(s) (DAAS-732) are to commence no later than July 1 of the state fiscal year and shall be undertaken and pursued in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion. All services required hereunder shall be completed on or before the end of the Agreement period, June 30 of the state fiscal year.
- 5. <u>Assignability and Contracting</u>. The County shall not assign all or any portion of its interest in this Agreement. Any purchase of services with Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults funding shall be carried out in accordance with the procurement and contracting policy of the community services provider or, where applicable, the Area Agency, which does not conflict with procurement and contracting requirements contained in 45 CFR Part 75, Subpart D-Post Federal Award Requirements, Procurement Standards. Federal funds shall not be awarded to any subreceipients who have been suspended or debarred by the Federal government. In addition, Federal funds may not be used to purchase goods or services costing over \$100,000 from a vendor that has been suspended or debarred from Federal grant programs.
- 6. <u>Compensation and Payments to the County</u>. The County shall be compensated for the work and services actually performed under this Agreement by payments to be made monthly by the Area Agency. Total reimbursement to the community service providers under this Agreement may not exceed the grand total of Block Grant funding, as specified on the <u>Provider Services</u> Summary format (DAAS-732).

(a) Interim Payments to the County

Upon receipt of a written request from the County, the Division of Aging and Adult Services, through the Area Agency, will provide the County Finance Officer with an interim payment equivalent to seventy percent (70%) of one-twelfth (1/12) of the County's Home and Community Care Block Grant allocation by the 22nd of each month.

(b) Reimbursement of Service Costs

Reimbursement of service costs are carried out as provided in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

c) Role of the County Finance Director

The County Finance Director shall be responsible for disbursing Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding to Community Service Providers in accordance with procedures specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

(d) Payment of Administration on Aging Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP)
Subsidy

NSIP subsidy for congregate and home delivered meals will be disbursed by the Division of Aging and Adult Services through the Area Agency to the County on a monthly basis, subject to the availability of funds as specified in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Services Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

If through the US Department of Agriculture Area Agency on Aging Elections Project, the County elects to receive a portion of its USDA entitlement in the form of surplus commodity foods in lieu of cash, the Area Agency will notify the County in writing of its community valuation upon notification from the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The delivery of commodity and bonus foods is subject to availability. The County will not receive cash entitlement in lieu of commodities that are unavailable or undelivered during the Agreement period.

7. Reallocation of Funds and Budget Revisions. Any reallocation of Block Grant funding between counties shall be voluntary on the part of the County and shall be effective only for the period of the Agreement. The reallocation of Block Grant funds between counties will not affect the allocation of future funding to the County. If during the performance period of the Agreement, the Area Agency determines that a portion of the Block Grant will not be expended, the grant administrator for the County shall be notified in writing by the Area Agency and given the opportunity to make funds available for reallocation to other counties in the Planning and Service Area or elsewhere in the state.

The County may authorize community service providers to implement budget revisions which do not cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for access, in-home, congregate, and home delivered meals services, as specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budget instructions issued to the County. If a budget revision will cause the County to fall below minimum budgeting requirements for any of the aforementioned services, as

specified in Division of Aging and Adult Services budgeting instructions issued to the County, the grants administrator for the County shall obtain written approval for the revision from the Area Agency prior to implementation by the community service provider, so as to assure that regional minimum budgeting requirements for the aforementioned services will be met.

Unless community services providers have been given the capacity to enter data into the Aging Resources Management System (ARMS), Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for entering amended service data into the Division of Aging and Adult Services Management Information System, as specified in the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

8. <u>Monitoring</u>. This Agreement will be monitored to assure that services are being provided as stated in the Division of Aging and Adult Service Monitoring Policies and Procedures at http://www.ncdhhs.gov/aging/monitor/mpolicy.htm.

The monitoring of services provided under this Agreement shall be carried out by the Area Agency on Aging in accordance with its Assessment Plan and as specified in Administrative Letter 12-08. As of July 1, 2012, DAAS Program Compliance Representatives (PCRs) are no longer monitoring HCCBG services provided through county departments of social services.

Counties and community service providers will receive a written report of monitoring findings in accordance with procedures established in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (http://www.ncdhhs.gov/aging/monitor/mpolicy.htm). Any areas of non-compliance will be addressed in a written corrective action plan with the community service provider.

9. <u>Disputes and Appeals</u>. Any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this Agreement shall be identified to the designated grants administrator for the Area Agency. In accordance with Lead Regional Organization (LRO) policy, a written decision shall be promptly furnished to the designated grants administrator for the County.

The decision of the LRO is final unless within twenty (20) days of receipt of such decision the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners furnishes a written request for appeal to the Director of the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, with a copy sent to the Area Agency. The request for appeal shall state the exact nature of the complaint. The Division of Aging and Adult Services will inform the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of its appeal procedures and will inform the Area Agency that an appeal has been filed. Procedures thereafter will be determined by the appeals process of the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The state agency address is as follows:

- 10. Termination for Cause. If through any cause, the County shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or the County has or shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, representations or stipulations of this Agreement, the Area Agency shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners written notice of such termination no fewer than fifteen (15) days prior to the effective date of termination. In such event, all finished documents and other materials collected or produced under this Agreement shall at the option of the Area Agency, become its property. The County shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily performed under this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Audit</u>. The County agrees to have an annual independent audit in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes, North Carolina Local Government Commission requirements, Division of Aging and Adult Services Program Audit Guide for Aging Services and Federal Office of Budget and Management (OMB) Uniform Guidance 2 CFR Part 200.

Community service providers, as specified in paragraph one (1), who are not units of local government or otherwise subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission are subject to audit and fiscal reporting requirements, as stated in NC General Statute 143C-6-22 and 23 and OMB Uniform Guidance CFR 2 Part 200, where applicable. Applicable community service providers must send a copy of their year-end financial statements, and any required audit, to the Area Agency on Aging. Home and Community Care Block Grant providers are not required to submit Activities and Accomplishments Reports. For-profit corporations are not subject to the requirements of OMB Uniform Guidance 2 CFR Part 200, but are subject to NC General Statute 143C-6-22 and 23 and Yellow Book audit requirements, where applicable. Federal funds may not be used to pay for a Single or Yellow Book audit unless it is a federal requirement. State funds will not be used to pay for a Single or Yellow Book audit if the provider receives less than \$500,000 in state funds. The Department of Health and Human Services will provide confirmation of federal and state expenditures at the close of the state fiscal year. 12. <u>Audit/Assessment Resolutions and Disallowed Cost</u>. It is further understood that the community service providers are responsible to the Area Agency for clarifying any audit exceptions that may arise from any Area Agency assessment, county or community service

provider single or financial audit, or audits conducted by the State or Federal Governments. In the event that the Area Agency or the Department of Health and Human Services disallows any expenditure made by the community service provider for any reason, the County shall promptly repay such funds to the Area Agency once any final appeal is exhausted in accordance with paragraph nine (9). The only exceptions are if the Area Agency on Aging is designated as a community service provider through the County Funding Plan or, if as a part of a procurement process, the Area Agency on Aging enters into a contractual agreement for service provision with a provider which is in addition to the required County Funding Plan formats. In these exceptions, the Area Agency is responsible for any disallowed costs. The County or Area Agency on Aging can recoup any required payback from the community service provider in the event that payback is due to a community service provider's failure to meet OMB Uniform Guidance CFR 2 Part 200, 45 CFR Part 1321 or state eligibility requirements as specified in policy.

- 13. <u>Indemnity</u>. The County agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Area Agency, its agents, and employees from and against any and all loss, cost, damages, expenses, and liability arising out of performance under this Agreement to the extent of errors or omissions of the County.
- 14. Equal Employment Opportunity and Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance. Both the County and community service providers, as identified in paragraph one (1), shall comply with all federal and state laws relating to equal employment opportunity and accommodation for disability.
- Data to be Furnished to the County. All information which is existing, readily available to the Area Agency without cost and reasonably necessary, as determined by the Area Agency's staff, for the performance of this Agreement by the County shall be furnished to the County and community service providers without charge by the Area Agency. The Area Agency, its agents and employees, shall fully cooperate, with the County in the performance of the County's duties under this Agreement.
- Rights in Documents, Materials and Data Produced. The County and community service providers agree that at the discretion of the Area Agency, all reports and other data prepared by or for it under the terms of this Agreement shall be delivered to, become and remain, the property of the Area Agency upon termination or completion of the work. Both the Area Agency and the County shall have the right to use same without restriction or limitation and without compensation to the other. For the purposes of this Agreement, "data" includes writings, sound recordings, or other graphic representations, and works of similar nature. No reports or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the County.

- 17. <u>Interest of the Board of Commissioners</u>. The Board of Commissioners covenants that neither the Board of Commissioners nor its agents or employees presently has an interest, nor shall acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which conflicts in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder, or which would prevent, or tend to prevent, the satisfactory performance of the service hereunder in an impartial and unbiased manner.
- 18. <u>Interest of Members of the Area Agency, Lead Regional Organization, and Others.</u> No officer, member or employee of the Area Agency or Lead Regional Organization, and no public official of any local government which is affected in any way by the Project, who exercises any function or responsibilities in the review or approval of the Project or any component part thereof, shall participate in any decisions relating to this Agreement which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he is, directly or indirectly, interested; nor shall any such persons have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds arising there from.
- 19. <u>Officials not to Benefit</u>. No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States of America, resident Commissioner or employee of the United States Government, shall be entitled to any share or part of this Agreement or any benefits to arise here from.
- 20. <u>Prohibition Against Use of Funds to Influence Legislation</u>. No part of any funds under this Agreement shall be used to pay the salary or expenses of any employee or agent acting on behalf of the County to engage in any activity designed to influence legislation or appropriations pending before Congress.
- 21. <u>Confidentiality and Security</u>. Any client information received in connection with the performance of any function of a community service provider or its subcontractors under this Agreement shall be kept confidential. The community service provider acknowledges that in receiving, storing, processing, or otherwise handling any confidential information, the agency and any subcontractors will safeguard and not further disclose the information except as provided in this Agreement and accompanying documents.
- 22. Record Retention and Disposition. All state and local government agencies, nongovernmental entities, and their subrecipients, including applicable vendors, that administer programs funded by federal sources passed through the NC DHHS and its divisions and offices are expected to maintain compliance with the NC DHHS record retention and disposition schedule and any agency-specific program schedules developed jointly with the NC Department of Cultural Resources, Division of Archives and Records. Retention requirements apply to the community service providers funded under this Agreement to provide Home and Community Care Block Grant services. Information on retention requirements is posted at http://www.ncdhhs.gov/control/retention/retention.htm and updated semi-annually by the NC DHHS Controller's Office. By funding source and state fiscal year, this schedule lists the earliest date that grant records in any format may be destroyed. The Division of Archives and

Records provides information about destroying confidential data and authorized methods of record destruction (paper and electronic) at http://archives.ncdcr.gov/For-Government/Retention-Schedules/Authorized-Destruction.

The NC DHHS record retention schedule is based on federal and state regulations and pertains to the retention of all financial and programmatic records, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other records supporting the expenditure of a federal grant award. Records legally required for ongoing official proceedings, such as outstanding litigation, claims, audits, or other official actions, must be maintained for the duration of that action, notwithstanding the instructions of the NC DHHS record retention and disposition schedule.

In addition to record retention requirements for records in any format, the long-term and/or permanent preservation of electronic records require additional commitment and active management by agencies. The community service provider will comply with all policies, standards, and best practices published by the Division of Aging and Adult Services regarding the creation and management of electronic records.

23. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement is executed and is to be performed in the State of North Carolina, and all questions of interpretation and construction shall be construed by the laws of such State.


