Mrs. Pugh provided information to the Board that included Organizational Committee recommendations, By Laws, and the 2004-2005 Annual Report.

Christy Saunders gave a brief detailed description and purpose of the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Staff Permit Officer Dave Parks was sworn in under oath by the Deputy Clerk. Mr. Parks stated "Mrs. Robertson applied for a special use permit to operate a home business at 151 Upton Road that will be a massage studio in her house. Dave Parks, having already been sworn in, presented the application. Mr. Parks stated "the Planning Board met on April 19, 2006 and voted 5-0 to approve the application with conditions as recommended in the Findings of Facts."

County Manager Randell Woodruff asked that the Board table this item until Monday, June 5, 2006 Commissioners meeting because the presenter, Attorney Morrison, was unable to attend the meeting. In addition, Ordinance No. 2006-05-02 will not be set for public hearing at this time.

Attorney's Report: Subdivision Moratorium Update

The Attorney's report was postponed until the Monday, June 5, 2006 Commissioners meeting.

Register of Deeds - Proposals for Addition

County Manager Randell Woodruff presented introductory proposals for consideration from Jeffrey A Lees, AIA, of Maryland in the amount of \$4,000.00, and Giffels Corporation of Raleigh, NC in the amount of \$45,000.00.

Chairman Jeralds recommended that the Board will need to table any decision in order to look over the proposals presented to the Board.

Presentation of FY2006-2007 County Budget, Budget Message by County Manager; Introduction of: Ordinance No. 2006-05-01 An Ordinance of the Board of County Commissioners of Camden County, NC Relating to the FY2006-2007 Budget, Resolution No. 2006-05-06 A Resolution of Commissioners of Camden County, NC Relating to a Budget for FY2006-2007, and Resolution No. 2006-05-07 A Resolution of the Camden County Board of Commissioners Establishing Salaries and Compensation for Various Boards and Commissioner for FY2006-2007

Finance Officer Clarann Mansfield passed out the updated Budget Message.

The Budget Message reads as follows:

THE CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

MEMBERS OF THE BOARD:

In accordance with General Statute 159-11, I hereby submit to you for your consideration the proposed FY 2006-07 budget for Camden County. A copy of this recommended budget has been filed with the Clerk to the Board and is available for public inspection.

GENERAL FUND

The FY 2006-2007 Budget is presented for your consideration. The Ad Valorem tax rate will remain at \$0.90. The funding is in place to cover the debt service on the \$10,000,000 Camden Intermediate School Loan and the \$2,000,000 Loan for renovations at Grandy Primary School. In the near future the county should be given a projection of the utility franchise fees it will receive.

With the \$0.90 per \$100 valuation and 97.28% collection rate on the real and personal property and 80.38% collection rate on vehicles, one cent of tax equals \$50,980.

Also included in the \$0.90 tax rate is the "School Dime" which is used to fund other school debt service.

This year's General Fund Budget is \$287,169 or 3% more than last year's budget. The department budget increases are minimal although there have been some increases:

SOUTH CAMDEN WATER & SEWER

The Reverse Osmosis Water Treatment Plant has been operating since October 2002 and has been very successful. We have 1891 active water accounts. We add several each months. With the "Debt Setoff" Program, we have collected \$4,142 in past due water bills.

With the permits in hand for the waste water treatment plant and spray field, \$400,000 in additional funding from the Rural Center, the \$600,000 CDBG Urgent Needs Grant and a promise of \$1,000,000 from CWMTF, the project will be going out to bid soon and construction should begin in late summer.

COURTHOUSE/SHILOH FIRE COMMISSION

The fire tax will remain at \$0.05 per \$100 valuation this year. The Fire Commission is purchasing a new Custom Pumper which will be delivered in the spring.

SOUTH MILLS FIRE COMMISSION

The Fire Commission has requested an increase, but the fire tax is included at the present \$.05 in their budget. \$10,000 is included for a match on a grant for a pumper truck and \$15,000 for other grant matches.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

The total budget shows an increase of \$100,684 in the county portion of the budget, due mainly to the Medicare increase. There should be no major changes in the service delivery or staffing.

JOYCE CREEK DRAINAGE DISTRICT

A \$0.02 per \$100 valuation tax rate for the district is again proposed for this year. This year the remainder of the debris from Hurricane Isabel will be cleared.

PARKS GRANTS FUND

A new fund has been created for the purpose of recording all the grants and expenses for the new additions at the Community Park.

REVALUATION RESERVE FUND

With the new revaluation scheduled for 2007 and Pearson Appraisal Company already working in the county, the county contribution had to be increased to \$100,000 this year.

LAND TRANSFER TAX FUND

The funding for this fund comes from the \$0.01 Land Transfer Tax which is levied on land sales. The revenues are estimated at \$540,000. The major expense will again be the debt service on the portion of the Yeskolski property in South Mills which is not being used for the sewer spray fields.

SCHOOL CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

A percentage of the Local Option Sales tax and "School Dime" funds will be used for debt service on the QZAB I, QZAB II and the \$1,000,000 Loan and the School Capital Outlay expense of \$200,000 and the balance on the mobile classrooms of \$57,836 and \$139,370 which is the MB Kahn contract that is over the original budget.

GRANDY RENOVATIONS/CAMDEN INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL PROJECT

The \$10,000,000 USDA toan is for 40 years at 4.25%. USDA will be doing the construction loan on \$10,000,000. The Grandy Primary renovations will also be funded by a \$2,000,000 loan from USDA and the county will have a local construction loan, which is budgeted.

Chairman Melvin Jearlds questioned Article XXIX. Tax Levy, Section 3 of Budget Ordinance No. 2006-05-01.

County Manager Randell Woodruff stated that the changes are based on the Board of Commissioners last two (2) budget sessions. The Commissioners suggested that they take time to review the updates to the budget due to the size of the report. Mr. Woodruff stated that the proposals are a presentation for the Board to review.

The Board received the budget message, draft Ordinance No. 2006-05-01, draft Resolution 2006-05-06 and draft Resolution 2006-05-07 and decided to set this portion of the meeting aside for the Budget workshop on Tuesday, May 16, 2006 in order to review the changes to the budget.

Consideration of Hazard Mitigation Plan Resolution No. 2006-05-05

Commissioner Clayton Riggs made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2006-05-05. The motion passed with Commissioners Jeffrey Jennings, Carolyn Riggs, Clayton Riggs, Mike Andrews, and Chairman Melvin Jeralds, voting aye; no Commissioner voting no; no Commissioner absent; no Commissioner not voting.

Resolution No. 2006-05-05 reads as follows:

Resolution No. 2006-05-05

A RESOLUTION OF THE CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RELATING TO THE CAMDEN COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, the citizens and property within the County of Camden are subject to the effects of natural hazards and man-made hazard events that pose threats to lives and cause damages to property, and with the knowledge and experience that certain areas, i.e., flood hazard areas, are particularly susceptible to flood hazard events; and

WHEREAS, the County of Camden desires to seek ways to mitigate situations that may aggravate such circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has in Part 6, Article 21 of Chapter 143; Parts 3, 5, and 8 of Article 19 of Chapter 160A; and Article 8 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes, delegated to local governmental units the responsibility to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has in Section 1 Part 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes (adopted in Session Law 2001-214—Senate Bill 300 effective July 1, 2001), states in Item (a) (2) "For a state of disaster proclaimed pursuant to G.S. 166A-6(a) after November 1, 2004, the eligible entity shall have a hazard mitigation plan approved pursuant to the Stafford Act"; and

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 states that local government must develop an All-Hazards Mitigation Plan in order to receive future Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Funds, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Camden County Board of Commissioners to fulfill this obligation in order that the County of Camden will be eligible for state assistance in the event that a state of disaster is declared for a hazard event affecting the County;

NOW, therefore, be it resolved that the Camden County Board of Commissioners hereby:

- I. Adopts the Camden County Hazard Mitigation Plan; and
- 2. Vests the County Manager with the responsibility, authority, and the means to:
 - (a) Inform all concerned parties of this action.
 - (b) Cooperate with Federal, State and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify floodplain or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to

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management of adjoining floodplain and/or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

- (c) Adjust the boundaries of Camden County and the municipal planning jurisdiction whenever a municipal annexation or extraterritorial jurisdiction revision results in a change whereby the municipality assumes or relinquishes the authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area in order that all Flood Hazard Boundary Maps (FHBMs) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) accurately represent current planning jurisdiction boundaries. Provide notification of boundary revisions along with a map suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating municipal corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction boundaries to all concerned parties.
- 3. Appoints the County Manager to assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan is reviewed annually and in greater detail at least once every five (5) years to assure that the Plan is in compliance with all State and Federal regulations and that any needed revisions or amendments to the Plan are developed and presented to the Camden County Board of Commissioners for consideration.
- Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

A public hearing was held on May 15, 2006.

Mr. Goulet did not attend the meeting to present his case. No change was recommended by the Tax Administrator. No action was taken.

Georgia Johnson

Mrs. Johnson stated she purchased a 1997 Ford Pickup with 340,000 miles for \$1500.00 and that the tax department valued the vehicle at \$8,640.00.

Following discussion, the vehicle would need to be more adequately assessed after the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) is verified by the Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV).
