The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the new jail financing.

Susan Christensen and Garland Bernette from USDA Rural Development were present.

Charles Ward of the Albemarle District Jail Commission called upon Garland Bernette to explain the funding process.

All Board members of Pasquotank, Camden and Perquimans agreed on locating the new jail in the Pasquotank Commerce Park and Pasquotank County Manager Randy Keaton suggested an Interlocal Agreement.

Attorney Herbert Mullen stated that he would draft an agreement.

Following discussion, the following motions were made:


Pasquotank County Commissioner Lloyd Griffin made a motion to be the lead county regarding the financing of the new jail. The motion passed 7-0.

Camden County Commissioner Clayton Riggs made a motion for Pasquotank County to be the lead county regarding the financing of the new jail. The motion passed 5-0.

Perquimans County Commissioner Tammy Miller White made a motion for Pasquotank County to be the lead county regarding the financing of the new jail. The motion passed 6-0.


Adjournment
